August Communion Offering is Food4Thought, a non-profit food assistance program run by Hastings College students and assisted by campus and community volunteers. Each week, volunteers pack and deliver bags of food to Hastings Public elementary schools. These bags are then sent home on Fridays with students whose families qualify for the Free and Reduced Lunch Program. Currently, Food4Thought provides supplemental meals designed to feed a family of six for two days to over 100 local families.

The farm feeds the students, trains smallholders in sustainable agriculture, and generates

She is responsible for working with healthrelated stakeholders to identify important needs and gaps in the general population's health education and to facilitate training programs.
