FROM PASTOR GREG

Dear First Presbyterian Church Family:

On Sunday 10/20, Rev. Dr. Gary Eller joined us as a guest preacher. He is a pastor and theology professor and currently serves as the President of the Omaha Presbyterian Seminary Foundation. Rev. Eller visits a lot of churches in his current role, so he has a good overview of what is happening in Presbyterian Churches around our region and the country.


Rev. Eller was visiting with me last March, just after my two-year anniversary of serving as your pastor. He asked me how things are going at our church. I told him about the new members' class we had just completed in February with 13 new members joining the church and the 15 baptisms we had scheduled this spring. I shared with him that our church had become a hub for flood relief in Nebraska. I talked about our thriving Christian Education programs for children, youth, and adults. I talked about our mission efforts, locally in Hastings and around the world. Rev. Eller said, "Greg, there is something special happening at your church." I asked him if he would come back and tell our church that, which is why he was our guest preacher on Sunday. 
Go & Serve Cinnamon Roll Sales

- 1) All of the cinnamon rolls **will be frozen** so that you can bake them whenever you'd like. They bake easily at home, and this simplifies the process for us.
- 2) We're doing two pick-up Sundays. Please indicate on the form when you'd like to pick-up your rolls. If you'd like your rolls by **Nov. 24**, then you must turn in the form by **Nov. 15**. If you'd like your rolls by **Dec 15**, then you must turn the form by **Dec. 6**.
- 3) The cost of the rolls is \$12 per pan, and they come 6 rolls to a pan. Included with each pan is a bag of frosting.


each of the boards, committees, and organizations that are a part of the life of our congregation.



Applications are now being accepted for Habitat homes. The application is at the front desk at Head Start on Marian Rd. Please consider applying.

Some of the qualifications are listed below:

- There must be a housing need: overcrowding, poor heating, unsafe/unsanitary conditions.
- You must have lived in the Hastings area for one year.
- You must be a citizen or permanent resident of the United States.
- Your family income must be in the low to moderate rate. The expense of the home (rent, taxes, etc.) must not be more than 30% of your monthly Adjusted Gross Income and your Adjusted Gross Income should be in the 60-80% of the Hastings Median Income. (We will help figure that out)
- We will look at debt to income ratio when considering if the applicant can afford to make the monthly payments. We don't want to set anyone up to lose their home.
- Homes are not given for free; they are an interest free home loan held by Hastings Habitat for Humanity.
- While most of the labor is completed by volunteers, materials cost us, and professional work like electricity and plumbing are hired out. Therefore Habitat homes are running approximately \$575-\$600/ month (utilities not included).
- You are required to complete 300 hours of "Sweat Equity" in the construction of your home (can assist with other houses, and you can get friends and family to help you out as needed also)
- If approved for a home, you will be required to make a down payment of \$500 when notified of
 - selection, you will continue to make monthly payments of approximately \$150.00 during construction and then a closing cost of approximately \$500 to apply to the legal closing costs.

Our plan is to get together on the 1st & 3rd Mondays of each month at 2:00pm. We will prepare the food for casseroles to be placed in the church freezers. 
