FROM PASTOR GREG

Dear First Presbyterian Church Family:

What a month it has been in the life of our church!

- On October 2 our children made communion bread as part of our Wednesday Night Live programming.
- On October 4 we sent a group of 36 pilgrims to the Holy Land.
- On October 6 we connected with our pilgrims and did a joint worship and communion service with them thanks to technology and a lot of hard work from our technology team. We also shared the bread made by our children and were blessed with beautiful music by our Chancel Choir.
- On October 13 we celebrated "Hastings College Sunday" with a visit from The Hastings College Choir, HC
 President Feezell, with Pastor Damen preaching a beautiful and meaningful sermon. Our connection with
 the College remains strong.
- On October 15 we had a Middle School Lock-In where the kids stayed overnight in the church with 3 brave adults. As part of their time, they helped set up for the Coat Giveaway scheduled for the next day.
- On October 16 we gave away more than 300 winter coats from our Memorial Room at the same time that we did the United Harvest Mobile Food Pantry distribution in the PEACE Center, feeding more than 500 families in our community. The team of volunteers for both events was huge and amazing.
- On October 17 we had a meaningful worship service where we welcomed back the Holy Land Pilgrims. Rev. Gary Eller from the Omaha Presbyterian Seminary Foundation was a guest preacher, and he asked us, "Will our faith have children?" as he reminded us that there is something special happening at our church.
- On October 25 our mission partners from the US-Mexico border arrived and taught a cooking class in our kitchen where we prepared enough food for 100 people.
- On October 26 we hosted the Presbytery meeting and the Presbyterian Women. Many volunteers from our church turned out to provide incredible hospitality. We served the food we had cooked the night before.
- On October 27 we had a glorious Sunday worship service that included our Children's and Youth Choirs and a visit from the Mexican Folkloric Dance Troupe that our church helps support. Our mission partners from Mexico shared what God is doing on the US-Mexico border and the ways we are connected through faith and love to our sisters and brothers there.
- On October 27 following worship, we had a potluck that maxed out the capacity of our fellowship hall. We shared food, fellowship, and fun together as an extended family of faith that included our mission partners and the Mexican Folkloric Dance Troupe.

Wow! What an active family of faith! These are just some of the many things that have happened this month in the life of our beloved church. If you helped support any of these activities by volunteering, THANK YOU! If you came and participated in any of these activities, THANK YOU! If you have given money to support these ministries, THANK YOU!

Go & Serve Cinnamon Roll Sales



The Go & Servers will once again be embarking on their cinnamon roll fundraiser. Let your hearts rejoice!

To place an order, please complete the form below and return it to the church office or place it in the box on the table in the office workroom. However, there are **a few**

changes this year, so please take note.

- 1) All of the cinnamon rolls **will be frozen** so that you can bake them whenever you'd like. They bake easily at home, and this simplifies the process for us.
- 2) We're doing two pick-up Sundays. Please indicate on the form when you'd like to pick-up your rolls. If you'd like your rolls by **Nov. 24**, then you must turn in the form by **Nov. 15**. If you'd like your rolls by **Dec 15**, then you must turn the form by **Dec. 6**.
- 3) The cost of the rolls is \$12 per pan, and they come 6 rolls to a pan. Included with each pan is a bag of frosting.
