
NOTABLE NOTES

FROM PASTOR GREG

Dear First Presbyterian Church Family:

As the weather cools and the days get shorter, we are closing in on the month of December and the beginning of the Season of Advent. While the calendar year resets on January 1, the church year resets on Advent each year. This provides us an opportunity to reflect on the last year and prepare our hearts and minds for the year to come. Your church staff and many volunteers have been hard at work to help facilitate this season of hope and preparation.

Under Pastor Damen's leadership, we have developed an Advent Devotional guide called "Faithful Advent" for the whole church to use during December. The guide provides a scripture and devotional reflection for every week of Advent and a daily prayer for each day of Advent. The weekly devotionals have been written by Damen, Kili, Bill Nottage-Tacey, and me. The daily prayers have been written by wide variety of church members including our Jr. and Sr. High Youth, Sara Babcock, members of the mission committee, and church staff.



One special feature of the Advent Devotional Guide is what we are calling a "Reverse Advent Calendar." Instead of opening a little box of an Advent calendar each day and getting a piece of chocolate or another small gift, we are encouraging every family in our church to give something to help our neighbors in need. We are partnering with Hastings Food Pantry, Catholic Social Services, Crossroads Shelter, and SASA to help us meet the needs of others. So each day of the Season of Advent, as you read the daily prayer, you are invited to pick up an item that has been requested by our local ministry partners. Bring those items to the church each week, and we will distribute them to help our neighbors in need. I can think of nothing more fitting to do during this season of Advent, a season marked by reflection, preparation, and hope. The Faithful Advent Devotional Guide will be available in the church office and in the Memorial Room November 24 and December 1.

As we prepare our hearts and minds to celebrate Jesus' birth and to wait in hopeful anticipation for His return, let us be the hands and feet of Christ to help our neighbors in need. Each time we pick up an item to be donated, may we reflect on John the Baptizer reminding us to "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near." By collecting these supplies for our neighbors, we are making the world just a little bit more like God's kingdom. May we reflect on Emmanuel, God with us. May we trust that God is with us and God is inspiring and equipping us to share God's love with others.
