Food from the Heart




Go & Serve Cinnamon Roll Sales

- 2) We're doing two pick-up Sundays. Please indicate on the form when you'd like to pick up your rolls. If you'd like your rolls by *Nov. 24, you must turn in the form by Nov. 15.* If you'd like your rolls by *Dec 15, you must turn the form by Dec. 6.*
- 3) The cost of the rolls is \$12 per pan, and they come 6 rolls to a pan. Included with each pan is a bag of frosting.


Go & Serve Bid Board Donations Needed
