FROM PASTOR GREG

Dear First Presbyterian Church Family:

We really ended on a high note this year! The Advent season has been a blessed time of worship, reflection, anticipation, generosity, and hope:

- Our Advent Devotional and reverse Advent calendar had an incredible response. You all brought in so many donations that will greatly benefit our local ministry partners including Crossroads, SASA, and others. The Giving Tree in the Memorial Room was also a success as you took tags off the tree and brought in wrapped gifts to support people with severe and persistent mental illness living in our community. Thank you for your incredible generosity!
- The Children's Christmas Program was shared on the third Sunday of Advent, December 15, and we also celebrated a baptism that Sunday! The children shared the story of Jesus' birth and how those involved might have felt. - The fourth Sunday of Advent was full of joyful sacred music! We did a modified service of Lessons and Carols and were blessed by the combined Chancel Choir and Calvin/Westminster Youth choirs. They sang two beautiful anthems and led our congregation in hymn singing. In addition, the Calvin/Westminster Youth Handbell choir shared an introit and the Chancel Handbell choir played two gorgeous and fun anthems. Nathan Jensen, a child of our church who is now studying to be an opera singer, sang a deeply moving solo of "O Holy Night" as the offertory. - By the time you read this, we will have also celebrated Christmas Eve at four services, including taking our Christmas Eve service on the road to the lobby of a retirement community to reach those who otherwise wouldn't be able to attend a service.

I also want to update you with some numbers that point to the health and vitality of our church. We added 25 new members and celebrated 18 baptisms this year.
