NOTABLE NOTES

Did you know the song "The Twelve Days of Christmas" has a secret code?

From 1558 until 1829, Roman Catholics in England were not permitted to practice their faith openly. Someone during that era wrote this carol as a catechism song for young Catholics. It has two levels of meaning: the surface meaning plus a hidden meaning known only to members of the Church.

Here is the key to the words of the song:

- 1. *The partridge* in a pear tree is Jesus Christ.
- 2. The two turtle doves are the Old and New Testaments.
- 3. The *three French hens* stand for faith, hope, and love.
- 4. The *four calling birds* are the four gospels. **
- 5. The *five golden rings* recalled the Torah or Law, the first five books of the Old Testament. **
- 6. The *six geese a-laying* stands for the six days of creation.
- 7. The seven swans a-swimming represent the sevenfold gifts of the Holy Spirit. **
- 8. The *eight maids a-milking* are the eight beatitudes. **
- 9. The nine ladies dancing are the nine fruits of the Holy Spirit. **
- 10. The ten lords a-leaping are the Ten Commandments. **
- 11. The *eleven pipers piping* stand for the eleven faithful disciples. **
- 12. The *twelve drummers drumming* symbolizes the twelve points of belief in the Apostles Creed. **
