FROM PASTOR GREG

Dear First Presbyterian Church Family:

I want to update you on the precautions we are taking related to Coronavirus and the Flu Season, beginning with advice from Jesus to his disciples on the night he was arrested, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid."

God has promised us peace and encouraged us to not be afraid. We must not let fear lead us as we respond to the world around us. That doesn't mean that we bury our heads in the sand and pretend as if nothing were happening; however, if we free ourselves from fear, we are able to respond with logic and love. My hope is that our church, and all of our members, will accept the peace that Christ offers us and respond to the world around us with logic and love.

To that end, here are the proactive steps we are taking for disease transmission prevention as we continue to be a place of warm welcome, hospitality, and love:

- We have changed the "Passing of the Peace" and discouraged handshaking
- Pastors Greg and Damen are no longer shaking hands before and after service when greeting church members
- We will not pass the offering plates through the pews; instead, they will be set up in the back of the church at the end of each center aisle; now is a great time to set up online giving through the website https://forms.ministryforms.net/viewForm.aspx?formId=9ce5ed95-8620-4c9e-89e4-f4eb536fb0dd
- We will not pass the "Friendship Pads"
- We have ordered new touchless soap dispensers for all the bathrooms
- We have put up signs in all the bathrooms reminding people to wash their hands for 20 seconds
- We have ordered hand-sanitizing stations
- Our custodial staff is taking extra care wiping down surfaces with recommended products
- Should it become necessary, we will change how we serve communion
- If you have any flu-like symptoms, we kindly ask that you stay home and listen to our worship service on the radio, watch our livestream on Facebook, or watch one of our weekly television broadcasts

These are all proactive steps we can take that are recommended by the Centers for Disease Control (CDC). Your staff team is monitoring the CDC recommendations daily and is in direct contact with South Heartland District Health Department. We will continue to follow their guidelines and recommendations, and we will do everything we can to keep you updated. One recommendation above and beyond the CDC guidelines that I will make is to pray! Please be in prayer for all who are impacted by disease and for all the healthcare workers and custodial staff that are working hard to slow the spread of the disease.

Should it become necessary to cancel Sunday morning worship services due to a recommendation to not hold public gatherings, we will still offer services over the radio and on our Facebook Livestream, as well as our two weekly television broadcasts.

Friends, it's hard to know what direction this will go. A natural response to the unknown is fear. But we are not people of fear; we are people of hope. May we be driven by hope, logic, and love as we respond, seeking to continue our call to welcome all, live love, and transform lives.
