### *Notable Notes* From Kili Wenburg

"I feel I am transitioning from a hidden to a bolder faith." "The idea of seeing God in all things has come alive for me." "I feel like I'm on the God Team now, and I want to do something for the God Team!"

These are just a few of the remarkable reflections shared by participants of Retreat in the Real World as we concluded our 34-week journey together on May 7.

Last fall, twenty-two individuals (seven of whom were not even Presbyterians) committed to meeting together every Thursday morning at 7 a.m. to learn and share and reflect on how God was moving in their lives. I was privileged to lead this group in what has turned out to be the most fulfilling endeavor (thus far) in my time as a member of the staff of FPC. The faithfulness, engagement, and participation of the members of this group astounded me and apparently resulted in amazing graces being showered upon them by our generous God! Praise God!

We followed a 34-week curriculum developed by Creighton University, which is a modernized version of the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius, originally written in the early 16th century. The fact that pilgrims world-wide continue to use the basic format of the Ignatian Exercises five hundred years later is a testament to the effectiveness of these exercises in leading one to deeper intimacy with God.

If you didn't have a chance to join us this program year but want a chance to get closer to God through a "retreat" that doesn't require you to leave home and which includes the encouragement and accountability of a group of like-minded pilgrims, please consider joining us next fall! <u>Most likely, our</u> <u>meetings will be held next fall around the lunch hour, perhaps Monday or Tuesday each week.</u> Stay tuned next fall for details!

That we (the participants of the 2019-2020 Retreat in the Real World) may continue to praise God for God's good gifts, I leave you with a few more of the beautiful sentiments shared by this year's "graduates."

"I have found community here."

"Being quiet with God is my happy place now. The quiet times keep me going."

"I'm praying more and leaving fear behind with regard to trust issues."

"It's been a gift to go beyond surface level in discussion of faith matters."

"I appreciate the new forms of prayer I learned, and I plan to continue using them."

"It's as though many parts of my life that didn't seem to fit together before now fit. I've been given clarity and affirmation."


