

## Breathe on Me, Breath of God 286







### RELAY FOR LIFE, 25th year! June 15-19, 2020 Join the FPC Virtual Team


Relay for Life has been a way for our church family to remember loved ones we have lost to cancer and to honor those who have survived. This year it will still happen, but because of the pandemic,
