NOTABLE NOTES FROM KILI WENBURG-MEMBERSHIP ROLLS COMMITTEE UPDATE

This spring, I was assigned to create and lead a short-term committee (Ann Koozer, Scott Shardelow, Lynne Friedewald, Brian Johnson, Sue Medsker-Nedderman, Doug Soderquist, and myself), tasked with fulfilling one of the goals of FPC's 5-year Strategic Plan: update the membership rolls.

Our first task was to formulate definitions for the various categories of church membership in order to submit these definitions to Session for approval and eventually to the congregation for addition into the church bylaws.

Next, we studied member data in order to determine which category best described each individual. (Recognizing that the data could potentially be incomplete and/or inaccurate, we will be contacting many members this summer to request help with confirming their correct membership status.)

Along the way in this process, we became aware of an implicit task for this committee: update contact information for all members. Since Care Teams were already making weekly quarantine-time check-in calls to many of our church members, they were asked to assist us with the contact information confirmation and update process. They and their work became an instant, invaluable resource for us. Thank you, Care Teams!! *Please always remember to contact the church office with changes to address, phone number, email, and so on. We can serve you well only with current information*.

You may be asking, **"So, why does this even matter?"** One major reason is **stewardship as a church body**: when we have people on our rolls incorrectly classified, we are likely either over-paying or under-paying our per capita apportionments. ["Per capita apportionments" are the approximately \$33/active member annual payments we make to the presbytery, synod, and general assembly.] We don't want to under-pay these because they are an essential form of support to the Presbyterian Church (USA) regionally and globally. Additionally, we don't want to over-pay these because then we would be unwittingly and unnecessarily draining money from our local church budget. Good stewardship requires a correct count of *active* members so that we can both support the connectional church and also wisely allocate our local funds.

A second, and perhaps even more important, reason we are doing this membership update is the reason that the 5-year strategic plan was concerned with **encouraging and facilitating greater participation of all members.** The folks of the 5-year strategic planning committee *believe in this church family*! They—and <u>many</u> others....perhaps even you reading this now!—have been blessed by involvement with Hastings FPC, and they want to share that with others! If individuals have fallen away from involvement in our church, we want to find ways to encourage them to come back so that we can learn and grow together in our service to God and one another. It is helpful to identify who those individuals are so that they can be contacted and encouraged to reengage.

If you are reading this now and know that you have not been active in recent months or years, consider this a warm invitation from your church family and a gentle nudge from God. We are ALL more than ready to get back out (post-coronavirus restrictions) and reengage in our world. There couldn't be a better time to put church back on the priority list! While there is not as much happening at the church in the summer, we will soon be re-starting in-person worship, and in the fall, lots of exciting programs will begin, something for everyone! See you at church!


WHEN you attend church, you take the side of angels, you count on the side of the spiritual, you tell the world you believe in God and Eternity and Immortality, and that's tremendous.


PEOPLE HELPING COMMUNITIES BY PROVIDING HOPE AND COMPASSION

We do see a drop in attendance after Easter every year.

Update on Giving:

March: \$31,484 (people were adjusting to mailing in checks or switching to on-line giving) April: \$67,795 (we recovered) YTD: \$200,097

We need *average* giving of \$53,000/month to make our budget for the year. We are right on track with where we need to be.

We ordinarily see a big boost in giving in November and December, as many people pay their whole pledge at once. We do usually see a drop in giving during the summer as people are traveling and not bringing their offerings in, and we expect to see the same this summer.

Update on Spending:

March Expense: \$61,389, April Expense: \$48,185 YTD TOTAL Expense: \$220,402 YTD Budgeted Expense: \$231,148

We have underspent the budget by \$11,000 so far this year and will continue to experience savings in utility expense.
