What's Up with Open Table

Our church has a long history of making sack lunches for the Open Table after church services during the month of July. Typically, between four to five thousand sack lunches are prepared in the course of the month. The Open Table Sack Lunch Program is a community program set up to provide one sack lunch per person per day, no questions asked. Various groups prepare the

lunches, which are distributed at Catholic Social Services during the week.

We are still going to make and provide sack lunches during the month of July; however, it will be a different format due to COVID-19 restrictions. Instead of our usual large assemblies after church services, we will be preparing sacks and sandwiches in different ways on different days.

We are once again grateful to Dave Dirks and Custom Pack, Inc. for helping provide the meat for this project.

We will be scheduling groups of less than 15 to fill sacks in Fellowship Hall during one-hour blocks at various times of the day, while following appropriate protocol for distancing and wearing masks.

GO & SERVE UPDATE



discuss. Those open conversations will take place July 2, 16, and 30.


