FROM PASTOR GREG

Dear First Presbyterian Church Family:

Since the start of this pandemic in March, your church staff and many volunteers have worked diligently to continue to produce resources for you, so that we can engage our hearts and minds and grow together in our faith, even when we can't gather together in person.

For PreK-5th Grade, Stephanie Brader, our amazing Director of Christian Education, sent home a packet to every family with a child in that age group. Each week, volunteer teachers or staff members come in to record a video lesson, which Steph edits together and posts to our church's YouTube page. The lessons coincide with the resources sent home in the packets and give our children an opportunity to see their favorite Sunday School teachers. Each week the children are reminded that they are loved by their church family, and they continue to grow and develop in their faith through these remote lessons. We have continued to produce high quality opportunities for youth and adults as well. Over the summer, we held a church-wide book study on the Pulitzer Prize winning novel *Gilead* by Marilynne Robinson. Part of that study included recording conversations between me, Pastor Damen, and three English professors who are members of our congregation. Even if you weren't able to join us this summer, you can still read the book (which is available in our church library) and watch the conversations we shared to inform your reading of the book. We have restarted our Adult Education Forums this fall as well. Dr. Dan Deffenbaugh led a three-week series entitled "Finding the God of Love and the Love of God." He traced the origins of God's love through the bible and helped us all to more fully understand God's love. You can watch those three classes by clicking here: <http://bit.ly/FPCGodOfLove>

Every week since March, Pastor Damen and I have recorded a short bible-study chat that we call the "Monday Check-In." We reflect on the scripture that will be preached the following week. You can watch all of those by clicking here: <http://bit.ly/FPCMonday>

If you don't have access to a computer but would like to watch any of these classes, we can put them on a DVD for you in the church office. You can also request a copy of any of our worship services on DVD at any time from the church office. There is no charge for either of those things.

If you would prefer to participate in a live Adult Education opportunity, you can come to the church on Tuesdays at noon for an in-person Bible Study that I lead. If you don't feel comfortable coming in, you can also participate via Zoom. We also have another weekly class held over Zoom on Wednesdays at noon led by Dr. Dan Deffenbaugh. This year they are studying the Book of Revelation. If you don't have a computer or don't know how to work Zoom, you can come to the church on Wednesday at noon, and we can set you up to participate.

These are just a few of the many ways that you are invited to engage your hearts and minds and grow in your faith at First Presbyterian Church of Hastings. We hope that you will take advantage of these opportunities as we all seek to become committed disciples of Jesus Christ.

CLERGY APPRECIATION

October is Clergy Appreciation month and October eleventh is Clergy Appreciation Day.

We are blessed with many Clergy, including Ministry Staff, Pastors and Reverends. Stephanie Brader, Kili Wenburg, Reverend Dr. Bill Nottage-Tacey, Reverend Don Canady, Reverend Damen Jensen-Heitmann, and Reverend Greg Allen-Pickett. Although none are Rabbis--all are teachers teaching us how to follow Jesus and to live in his ways with love for one another.

Clergy is defined as a group ordained to perform pastoral or sacerdotal functions in a Christian Church. (Sacerdotal functions do not apply at FPC. They refer to a doctrine of sacrificial functions and spiritual or supernatural powers to ordained priests).

All members of FPC are Ministers from whose midst some are called to Ordered Ministries, to fulfill particular functions. Many of us at FPC are ordained, some to serve as Deacons, others as Ruling Elders, and a select few to Ministers of the Word and Sacrament (Teaching Elders). All members and those in Ordered Ministries serve together under the mandate of Christ.

1 Peter 5:2 NRSV Tend the flock of God that is in your charge, exercising the oversight, not under compulsion but willingly, as God would have you do it—not for sordid gain but eagerly.

Pastor in the Christian Church is the appropriate concern to the giving of spiritual guidance. Reverend is a title of a member of the Clergy. Rabbi is a Jewish scholar, teacher, and master.

Acts 20:28 NRSV Keep watch over yourselves and over all the flock, of which the Holy Spirit has made you overseers, to shepherd the church of God that he obtained with the blood of his own Son.

God has presented us with these women and men.

Jeremiah 3:15 NRSV I will give you shepherds after my own heart, who will feed you with knowledge and understanding.

God has strong, strict standards for all of us, especially to his chosen leaders.

2 Timothy 1:13 NRSV *Hold to the standard of sound teaching that you have heard from me, in the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus.*

2 Timothy 4:2 NRSV *Proclaim the message; be persistent whether the time is favorable or unfavorable; convince, rebuke, and encourage, with the utmost patience in teaching.*

2 Corinthians 9: 13-14 NRSV *Through the testing of this ministry, you glorify God by your obedience to the confession of the gospel of Christ and by the generosity of your sharing with them and with all others, while they long for you and pray for you because of the surpassing grace of God that he has given you.*

In these restricted days of pandemic, the good news is that it is very safe, very heartfelt, and very easy to show your appreciation of our Clergy. The best way and greatest gift you can offer is to pray earnestly for them and their families. Pray to God to continue to guide our Christian Clergy, our leaders, our teachers. From the Presbyterian Disaster Assistance Director, The Rev. R. Laurie A. Kraus:

Dear Friends,

In the book of Acts, the story of Pentecost tells of the amazing way the Holy Spirit pulled together a fragmented and frightened group of Jesus' followers, resting on them and filling them with fresh ways to speak the good news of God's love. The story is told in a way that reminds believers of the old story of the tower of Babel in Genesis, where the unity and common purpose of humanity was shattered through pride, misunderstanding and confusion. It was a disaster that shattered human community. I am thinking today how those old stories resonate in new ways during this strange season of the COVID-19 pandemic. In the U.S. and across the globe, people have found common purpose and demonstrated nobility in the face of threat, serving others and preserving life, even while others have allowed fear and crisis to diminish their own humanity and harm the common good. It was, as Dickens once penned, *the best of times and the worst of times.*

Yet, I am also filled with gratitude for the ways this *new* moment of Pentecost is also unfolding, as good news is demonstrated, transcending differences of language, culture and race, through the gifts, prayers, and diligent work of so many in the Presbyterian family.

Since the middle of March, PDA has been able to put two million dollars into the field to respond to COVID-19, grants made possible by faithful gifts over the last few years to the general fund of Presbyterian Disaster Assistance. In the U.S., congregations receiving small grants from PDA have expanded the operations of existing food banks and opened new ones. Even while not meeting for in-person worship, they have reached out a hand to those in their neighborhoods living without shelter, established new relationships with communities living on the margin, refugees, and people whose lack of access to clean water makes sanitation practices challenging, if not impossible. Our international partners are doing much the same, across the globe, and in addition to emergency food, sanitation, water and shelter, are providing awareness and sensitization campaigns in areas too remote for a strong governmental or regional approach and offering spiritual care along with tangible resources. And even as COVID-19 dominates out thoughts, resources and common life,

tornados, typhoons, fires and floods still work devastation...and PDA is still showing up and helping. Through all these communities at work in local response to the pandemic, and in your continued commitment to ongoing disaster response, you have spoken the language of love in a tangible, impactful way, offering a gift that helps to bring renewed hope and joy to those individuals and communities suffering from disaster and its aftermath. On their behalf, thank you.

Please know that your gift to Disaster Relief-Lebanon/Syria blesses those who walk the hard road toward recovery, letting them know they are not alone, helping them to find hope in the midst of chaos, and making real the promise of Pentecost-the tangible demonstration of the “mighty acts of God” in healing and restoration...in the language each one needs most to hear.

The First Presbyterian Church PEACE Center gym is a great place to walk during the winter months. (Group size limited to 15).

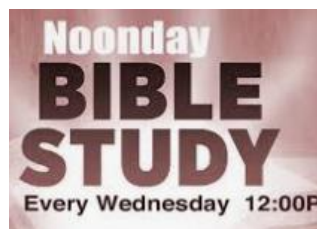

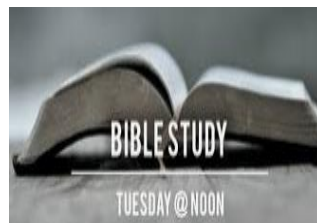

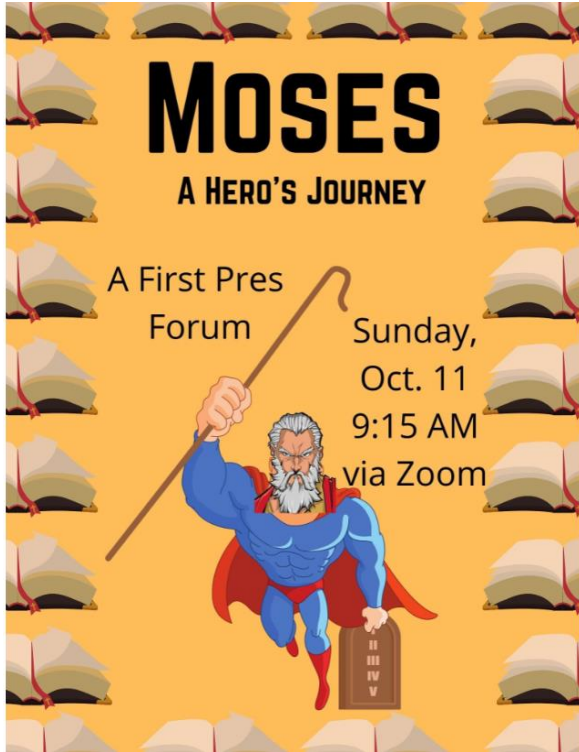
Tuesday Noon Bible Study with Pastor Greg




Go & Serve Cinnamon Roll Sales

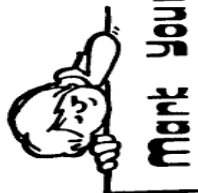
