

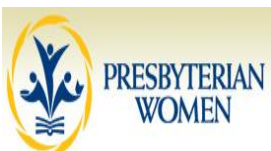
This Week at FPC --- November 2 – November 8, 2020

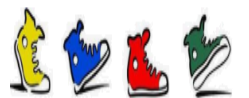
Update on Sunday School/Youth Group for the fall


