NOTABLE NOTES

FROM PASTOR GREG

Dear First Presbyterian Church Family:

When we think of the church and how the Holy Spirit is at work in our beloved community, we don't usually think of numbers and data. However, it is important to track how things are going in the life of our church. While not every indicator of the health of our congregation is a trackable metric, there are some statistics we can look at that indicate the vitality of our church.

NEW MEMBERS: On Sunday, we added **7 new members** to our church family! Four of those are from the confirmation class from last year that we have finally completed this Fall. Three of those are people who have made the commitment to join our church and attended a new member's class that we held last month. In addition to the three that joined us this week, we have another group who have asked to join once COVID-19 is over. It is a pretty remarkable thing that our church is growing in membership during this crazy pandemic time. We hope you were able to tune into worship on Sunday, November 15, to see these new members join our church.

ATTENDANCE: Another number that we track to measure engagement is attendance. Prior to March of this year, that was an easy thing to do: we just counted the people in church on a Sunday morning. Obviously, that is more challenging now that we are doing Sunday worship remotely, and we can't track our radio listeners or television watchers, but we can still track attendance via the internet. The good news is that we have not experienced a drop in attendance during remote worship; we are actually up! Last fall, we were averaging **231** people per Sunday in Worship. This fall, we have been averaging **258**! That is nearly **12%** growth! While I am really missing in-person worship, as I know so many of you are, I am excited to see this growth in "attendance" in this unprecedented pandemic time.

FINANCIAL SUPPORT: Tracking tithes and offerings is another important way to measure the health of the church. I am so grateful to be leading such a generous church; thank you for your ongoing support of our ministries and mission! As of right now, our giving is up **5%** over where it was at this time last year. Wow! You are such faithful givers and are continuing to support the work of your church even when we can't gather in person to worship. Thank you to each one of you for your generosity, and I give thanks to God for each of you and the many ways you support our beloved church, including your financial giving. I hope we can continue this trend and end the year with a positive budget, so if it is possible for your family, please fulfill your pledges. This will allow us to start 2021 ready to thrive, even if we don't know exactly what the year will bring.

REMOTE LEARNING PARTICIPATION: Much of our Christian Education for children and adults has been remote since March. We are able to track how many people tune into our various offerings, including the weekly Christian Education videos produced by Steph Brader and our Sunday School teachers, as well as the adult opportunities like the Monday Check-In, Friday Feature, Adult Forums, and others. These are all offered through our church's website, Facebook page, YouTube page, and SoundCloud account. We are excited to share that all of these are getting significant participation with over **4,000 views** on all of these platforms in the last 6 months.

These are numbers that we track to gauge the health and engagement of our church family. You can see more details of these numbers in this issue of the Home Page. Of course, these numbers don't tell the whole story, but they are a good way for us to know how we are doing as a church. One thing that church health experts say is, "If you don't get counted, you don't count." I want you to know that all of you count in God's eyes and in mine. I miss seeing all of you in person but am so glad that we continue to thrive as a church family, even in these unprecedented times. Please continue to connect with us and pray that COVID-19 will pass and we can resume our in-person activities soon.

Eraser—to remind you that everyone makes mistakes, and we can forgive them (Genesis 50:15-21).

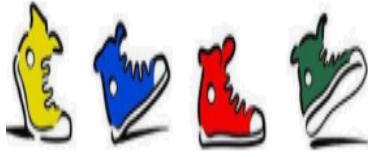
Chewing gum—to remind you to stick with it, and you can accomplish anything (Philippians 4:13).




Go & Serve Cinnamon Roll Sales

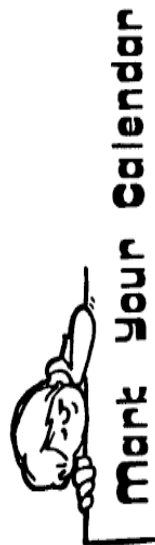
