## BLE NOTES FROM PASTOR GREG

Dear First Presbyterian Church Family:

I am writing with another update regarding COVID-19. Session, the leadership council of the church, met last week to discuss the safety of meeting in person. Given the significant spike in COVID-19 diagnoses and hospitalizations over the last few weeks, and the fact that our local South Heartland District Health Department has moved the risk dial needle into the red "Severe" risk zone for spread of the disease Session voted on the following:

- Suspend in-person worship until our meeting on January 21st.
- Provide Zoom meetings for all church-related groups, and limit meetings in the building to 5 people or less with masks and social distancing required.
- Suspend Middle School and High School youth groups meeting in the building until January.
- Close the church building and the PEACE Center to all non-church related groups.

Pastor Damen and I spoke at length about these decisions during our worship service on Sunday 11/22. I provided an update on the rationale behind our decision that you can watch here: <u>https://youtu.be/AyNTFJxjw4s</u>

Pastor Damen preached a thoughtful and faithful sermon on Matthew 25, our call to care for the vulnerable, and how that drives our response to COVID-19 that you can watch here: <a href="https://youtu.be/OASrHpMzneo">https://youtu.be/OASrHpMzneo</a>

We recognize how hard this decision is for all of you, it was a very difficult decision for us. The good news is that your church staff and many volunteers are working diligently to provide opportunities for us to connect as a family of faith during Advent and Christmas. A few of those opportunities include:

- An advent devotional guide, written by church members and staff, which was mailed to every home. The guide includes a reverse advent calendar to collect items for our ministry partners.
- Continued remote Christian Education opportunities for all ages include weekly videos and activities for PreK-5<sup>th</sup> graders and an abundance of Adult Education opportunities.
- Continued Stay-at-Home worship services broadcast on Facebook Live, 1550 AM Radio and television.
- A weekly Advent/Christmas hymn sing in the church parking lot every Sunday in Advent at 12noon.
- Weekly broadcasts of previously recorded Choral Cantatas sung by our Chancel Choir every Sunday at 2pm.
- A Drive-In Christmas Eve Service in the Hastings College Football Stadium parking lot at 5:30pm on December 24<sup>th</sup>. It will include hymns, a special activity for children and candlelit Silent Night.
- A special Christmas Eve evening prayer service broadcast on Facebook Live at 11pm for the night owls.

Please stay tuned for more details on all of these opportunities to celebrate the Advent and Christmas season as a family of faith, even in these strange times. While we deeply lament the lost opportunities to gather in-person in this season, we are seeking to protect the health and safety of our church family and our community and we are grateful for these ways to stay connected in this time.

### God's Under the Bed

My brother Kevin thinks God lives under his bed. At least that's what I heard him say one night. He was

praying out loud in his dark bedroom, and I stopped outside his closed door to listen. "Are you there, God?" he said. "Where are you? Oh, I see. Under the bed." I giggled softly and tiptoed off to my own room.

Kevin's unique perspectives are often a source of amusement. But that night something else lingered long after the humor. I realized for the first time the very different world Kevin lives in. He was born 30 years ago, mentally disabled as a result of difficulties during labor. Apart from his size (he's 6'2"), there are few ways in which he is an adult. He reasons and communicates with the capabilities of a 7 year old, and he always will. He will probably always believe that God lives under his bed, that Santa Claus is the one who fills the space under our tree every Christmas, and that airplanes stay up in the sky because angels carry them.

I remember wondering if Kevin realizes he is different. Is he ever dissatisfied with his monotonous life? Up before dawn each day, off to work at a workshop for the disabled, home to walk our cocker spaniel, returning to eat his favorite macaroni-and-cheese for dinner, and later to bed. The only variation in the entire scheme are laundry days, when he hovers excitedly over the washing machine like a mother with her newborn child.

He does not seem dissatisfied. He lopes out to the bus every morning at 7:05 eager for a day of simple work. He wrings his hands excitedly while the water boils on the stove before dinner, and he stays up late twice a week to gather our dirty laundry for his next day's laundry chores. And Saturdays -- oh, the bliss of Saturdays! That's the day my dad takes Kevin to the airport to have a soft drink, watch the planes land, and speculate loudly on the destination of each passenger inside. "That one's goin' to Chi-cargo!" Kevin shouts as he claps his hands. His anticipation is so great he can hardly sleep on Friday nights. I don't think Kevin knows anything exists outside his world of daily rituals and weekend field trips. He doesn't know what it means to be discontent. His life is simple. He will never know the entanglements of wealth or power, and he does not care what brand of clothing he wears or what kind of food he eats. He recognizes no differences in people, treating each person as an equal and a friend. His needs have always been met, and he never worries that one day they may not be.

His hands are diligent. Kevin is never so happy as when he is working. When he unloads the dishwasher or vacuums the carpet, his heart is completely in it. He does not shrink from a job when it is begun, and he does not leave a job until it is finished. But when his tasks are done. Kevin knows how to relax. He is not obsessed with his work or the work of others.

His heart is pure. He still believes everyone tells the truth, promises must be kept, and when you are wrong, you apologize instead of argue. Free from pride and unconcerned with appearances, Kevin is not afraid to cry when he is hurt, angry or sorry. He is always transparent, always sincere.

And he trusts God. Not confined by intellectual reasoning, when he comes to Christ, he comes as a child. Kevin seems to know God -- to really be friends with Him in a way that is difficult for an "educated" person to grasp. God seems like his closest companion.

In my moments of doubt and frustrations with my Christianity, I envy the security Kevin has in his simple faith. It is then that I am most willing to admit that he has some divine knowledge that rises above my mortal questions. It is then I realize that perhaps he is not the one with the handicap -- I am. My obligations, my fears, my pride, my circumstances -- they all become disabilities when I do not submit them to Christ.

Who knows if Kevin comprehends things I can never learn? After all, he has spent his whole life in that kind of innocence, praying after dark and soaking up the goodness and love of the Lord. And one day, when the mysteries of heaven are opened, and we are all amazed at how close God really is to our hearts, I'll realize that God heard the simple prayers of a boy who believed that God lived under his bed.

Kevin won't be surprised at all.

### Go & Serve Cinnamon Roll Sales




