

FROM PASTOR GREG

Dear First Presbyterian Church Family:

We recognize that the practicing of our faith, particularly during the season of Advent and Christmas, is so often tied to in-person gatherings. Because of COVID-19, our opportunities for in-person gatherings have been limited for the last nine months. I miss those gatherings and the opportunity to connect with God, and I am hearing from church members that you feel the same way.



I was talking to Kili Wenburg, our Parish Associate about this. She had a great idea: Let's offer a weekly spiritual practice to help us connect with God and grow in our faith in this strange pandemic time. Kili

wrote this introduction for this new practice:

For many of us, attending church on Sunday mornings is our primary, if not only, means of connecting with our church family and with God. We give thanks for the technology and hard work of staff and volunteers who make it possible every week for us to worship "together apart," but it's not quite the same. Additionally, the uncertainty, isolation, stress, losses, and grief associated with living through a pandemic have created an increased need for the hope and security which can only be found in God. Because our familiar way of connecting with God (in-person worship) is not currently available, and because we all have more open calendars than ever before, this is the perfect time to learn new spiritual practices! God is just as present and available to us as ever before; it's just that we may need to learn new ways of seeking and finding God's presence in these new times. To that end, I will be creating short videos (90 seconds or so) each week, each of which will introduce a simple spiritual practice. Try these new practices for just 5 minutes a day, 5 days a week--5 for 5-and watch as your heart learns to recognize God in events, people, feelings, etc. as never before!

All of the practices for December are based on the Advent Devotional guide our church published, which we mailed to every home. Each Sunday in worship, we will introduce a new practice and then post the video links so that you can revisit the practices.




