(The tradition of First Presbyterian Church is to invite a family to light the Advent candle. Our Christian understanding of family includes all sisters and brothers in Christ who live in fellowship together and take care of one another. During the last year, the Session has spent countless hours meeting to faithfully lead the church in this pandemic time and has bonded together as part of the family of faith.)

This is the second Sunday in Advent. Today, we light two purple candles. The first is the candle of hope.

Advent is a time of waiting and hoping.

The second is the candle of peace.

We anticipate the coming Christ and the peace he brings!

Isaiah 11 describes the Kingdom of God as a place where hatred, anger, and violence are no more,

Where peace becomes a way of life.

The wolf shall live with the lamb; the leopard shall lie down with the kid. The calf and the lion will feed together.

Violence in our communities will cease; violence between nations will cease. People will work together in harmony, seeking solutions that benefit all.

And a little child shall lead them;

The Church, the body of Christ, will lead this movement for peace.

Today we light the candle of peace as a prayer and a reminder of God's vision for the world.

And as this light burns and grows, we will wait, eagerly, longing for the birth of a child, and for the peace only love can bring. May peace light up the world. Come, let us worship the Prince of Peace!






POINSETTIAS






