Baptisms, Lent, Restarting In-Person Worship, Holy Week and more! FROM PASTOR GREG

Dear First Presbyterian Church Family:

I'm delighted to see the ways that our church is thriving, even in these strange times! Did any of you catch the baptism of Colton Hemje on 2/21/21? That was our first baptism in over year because of COVID-19, and what a joy it was! Colton's sisters and brother leaned over the railing to watch him join our family of faith. Here's more joyful news: we already have 3 more baptisms scheduled over the next few months!

We started the Season of Lent on Wednesday 2/17 with a unique Ash Wednesday opportunity. We shared an Ash Wednesday service on Facebook and YouTube and had over 75 people watch the service. We also opened our sanctuary for people to come down, pray, and receive ashes. More than 35 of our members joined us for that. While it looked a little different than in previous years, it was a deeply meaningful way to reflect on the start of our Lenten journey with Christ to the cross.

As part of our Lenten journey, we also mailed a devotional guide, written by Pastor Damen and Kili Wenburg, to every household in the church. Our hope is that we can all read through this guide together and that it will unite us as a family of faith during this time of reflection and repentance. The theme of the guide is Christian Unity, based on Jesus' words in John 17: *"The glory that you have given me I have given them, so that they may be one, as we are one, I in them and you in me, that they may become completely one, so that the world may know that you have sent me and have loved them even as you have loved me."* If you would like a digital copy of this guide, you can click here: http://bit.ly/FPCH-Lent

If you haven't already heard, after 49 weeks, we have restarted In-Person worship in our sanctuary! Our first In-Person worship service was 2/28/21. We had 99 people in-person and another 209 who were watching the service at home via Facebook Live. It was wonderful to have people back in the sanctuary and also wonderful to still have the Stay-at-Home worship option. Due to guidance from our local health department, things do look a little different: face masks are required, there is no congregational hymn singing, and social distancing is observed. So if you come, you may not get to sit in your regular pew, but you will get to come into the sanctuary to worship God and share fellowship with your family of faith. We are also excited about Holy Week this year! We will celebrate Palm Sunday on 3/28 (RSVP at the link above). In addition to the palms, we will also have a baptism at that service! On 4/1 we will have a Maundy Thursday service in-person and on-line, and on 4/2 we will have a Good Friday service in-person and on-line. We will hold a prayer vigil from Good Friday through Easter morning. You can read more details about these services in the Home Page.

For our Easter service, which typically has 400-600 people in attendance, we knew we couldn't fit in our sanctuary due to the social distancing guidelines. So, we are partnering with Hastings College and our Easter service will be held in the Lynn Farrell basketball arena. It will include our Chancel Choir, the Cathedral Brass, and many of the other elements that we love about Easter. The arena seats almost 4,000, so we will have plenty of space for social distancing, and masks will be required.

First Presbyterian Church is thriving thanks to your support and participation in the life of our church. Thank you for all you have done over the last year. We hope you can join us in person or on-line over the next few weeks of Lent and during Holy Week as we continue to "be the church together!"
