FROM PASTOR GREG

Dear First Presbyterian Church Family:

It was just one year ago that we suspended our In-Person worship and started to do everything remotely due to the COVID-19 pandemic. We were in the middle of the Season of Lent and all of us were reeling from the news of what was happening in our community, our nation, and our world.

Your church staff members were sitting in our virtual staff meeting over the now ubiquitous Zoom and we were trying to figure out what to do. So much of our life as a family of faith was built around meeting in-person and now we had to figure out what it meant to “be the church” outside of our sanctuary and without the benefit of in-person gathering and fellowship. I always knew we had amazing staff members at our church, but it was during those first few weeks of the pandemic that I developed an even deeper appreciation for our staff team. Without skipping a beat, everyone pivoted and started to dream of ways to help our church thrive in this new environment.

Together we dreamed up the “Palm Sunday Procession” that would allow us to gather at a safe distance in our cars and drive around to different symbolic locations in our community to pray for those impacted by COVID-19. The parade route took us to a City of Hastings parking lot where we prayed for government and leaders; to the Mary Lanning parking lot where we prayed for health care workers; to the high school parking lot where we prayed for educators and students; and to a business parking lot where we prayed for business and industry. This was just one of dozens of creative ideas that your church staff came up with in those first weeks of the pandemic, and they have continued throughout the year.

Here we are one year later. Our shared life together still looks different, but things are slowly returning some semblance of a new normal. I continue to be amazed by the creativity and commitment of our church staff, along with so many volunteers, who all helped to keep our church thriving in the midst of this pandemic.

As we approach Palm Sunday and Holy Week this year, I am delighted to share with you how we will be celebrating in 2021! We will observe Palm Sunday on March 28. Worship will be offered both In-Person and Stay-at-Home. If you’d like to join us In-Person, please click on this link and fill out the form to RSVP: <https://bit.ly/FPCH-Res328> This will allow us to estimate the number of people attending and provide for social distancing. Face masks are required and there will be no congregational hymn singing In-Person. We will be celebrating a baptism on Palm Sunday! And for those who come in-person, each seat will be preset with a palm branch to wave. You can also join us for Stay-at-Home worship on Facebook Live or listen on the radio.

Holy Week will include Maundy Thursday and Good Friday services offered both In-Person in our sanctuary and Stay-at-Home via Facebook Live.

Easter Sunday will be an incredible celebration this year! Due to the social distancing guidelines, we knew we couldn’t fit enough people safely in our sanctuary. So we are partnering with Hasting College to hold our Easter Service in the Lynn Farrell Arena! This arena has a capacity of more than 3,000, so we will have plenty of room for social distancing. Because of the larger and well-ventilated space, we will also be joined by our combined Chancel and Calvin/Westminster Youth Choirs as well as the Cathedral Brass. Together, as a family of faith, we will boldly proclaim “Christ has Risen! Christ has Risen Indeed!” Thanks to our amazing volunteer technology team, this service will also be streamed live and broadcast over the radio for those who cannot join us in-person.

It has been a challenging year for all of us. As we approach Holy Week once again, my prayer is that each of you will find a way to stay connected with one another and your family of faith. We hope that you can join us for our upcoming services either In-Person or Stay-at-Home. And I would ask that you join me in a prayer of thanksgiving for our incredible church staff and volunteers who have worked so hard to help keep us connected to one another and to our shared faith in Jesus Christ over this past year. May this upcoming Holy Week provide us an opportunity to continue in our discipleship journey together with Christ from the cross, to the grave, to the glorious resurrection!




FRAUD ALERT
