Why is there a Food Truck in the PEACE Center Parking Lot? FROM PASTOR GREG

Dear First Presbyterian Church Family:

If you have driven by the church this week, you may have noticed Beto's Tacos, a new food truck, parked in our PEACE Center parking lot. And you may have asked yourself, what is that doing there? Great question! Two years ago, we revised our Mission Statement for the church, and we developed a strategic plan. The mission statement reads like this:

Welcoming all.

Living the love of God and neighbor.

Seeking to transform ourselves, our community, and our world to be more Christ-like through service, worship, prayer, education, and fellowship.

One of the three "Key Action Items" of our strategic plan was *Service & Outreach*. Through the strategic planning process, our service and outreach efforts emerged as a top priority for our church; we are called to share the love and light of Christ both within our walls and outside our walls, into the community. This is the heartbeat of the church, and we seek to build upon an already strong legacy in this area.

Part of our outreach efforts have included building bridges with our Hispanic and Latino neighbors. We do this through our work with Proteus and the migrant farm workers, through our Spanish Classes offered to our members and the community, through our hosting of *Raices de mi Pueblo*, the Mexican folkloric dance group that rehearses in our building and at worship once a year, and many other ways. Six months ago, we were approached by an entrepreneurial family looking for a place to park their food truck. They identified First Presbyterian Church of Hastings as an ideal site, both because of our location and because of our hospitality and outreach in the community.

Your Session and Trustees received this request and had good conversation about it. One member of Session shared that her daughter lives in Denver and started attending a church because the church hosted food trucks. That got us thinking that this could be a win-win-win situation for our church, the entrepreneurial family, and our community. By letting this food truck park in our parking lot, we can potentially further strengthen our bridge-building with our neighbors, we can become a site of hospitality for the community, and we can raise funds to help pay for parking lot repairs at the PEACE Center through a monthly donation that the food truck gives to the church for using a portion of our parking lot. Given our proximity to Mary Lanning hospital, the largest employer in our city, and our central location in town, we may end up with some great foot traffic. As people are enjoying delicious food, we hope they will look around and see the PEACE Center and our church building and come join us!

If you are curious about the logistics of all of this, feel free to reach out to a member of Session or Trustees or come talk to me. We are starting with a six-month contract to see how this goes. If you have any feedback, please let us know.

I am grateful for the creative minds on our Session and Trustees, who were presented with this opportunity and decided to act upon it. I am grateful for our church and our bridge-building and outreach efforts that led to this opportunity. And I am grateful to God for this church family that seeks to serve our community in so many ways. May we continue to find ways to be a source of light and love in our community!
