FROM PASTOR GREG

Christ is Risen! Christ is Risen Indeed! This is a traditional Easter greeting that has been spoken by Christians for almost 2,000 years. You may remember that Pastor Damen and I invited the congregation to say it with us on Easter Sunday. But we don't limit this greeting just to Easter morning; we are a resurrection people who boldly proclaim this truth through our worship year-round and through the way that we live our lives every day.

I will be inviting you to proclaim this resurrection truth by sharing this greeting with you every Sunday through May. That's because Easter is not just a single day but a season in our church calendar year. We celebrate Easter for almost two months during this Season of Easter, until we get to Pentecost Sunday, which falls on May 23rd this year.

During this Season of Easter, as we continue to reflect on the resurrection, we will retell the stories of Christ's post-resurrection appearances in a sermon series entitled "Living in a post-resurrection world." Remember, there are 40 days between Christ coming out of the tomb and when Christ ascends to heaven. During those 40 days, Jesus makes many appearances to his followers. We revisit these stories of Christ's post-resurrection appearances every year because they are important for us to develop a full understanding of who Christ is and to understand the work that Christ has done for us.

Through this sermon series, we will explore the good news that Christ is risen--not just from the grave 2000 years ago, but in every aspect of our lives and world. And by studying these post-resurrection appearances, we will seek to answer this question: How do we recognize the presence of the living Christ and embrace a sense of awe and gratitude, even in the mundane and ordinary moments of our lives?

Below is a brief outline of what the sermon series will look like and which scripture we will study each Sunday between now and Pentecost Sunday on May 23. Now is a good time to remind you that if you want to go deeper in your study of these scriptures, we offer you two opportunities every week to do that. First is the Monday Check-In, a broadcast that Pastor Damen and I do each week. This is an informal Bible study that you can listen to like a radio broadcast, download as a podcast, or watch on YouTube. The second opportunity is a live Bible study that we offer both in-person and via Zoom on Tuesdays at noon. Whichever Pastor is preaching leads a study of the scripture for the following Sunday. Come join us in person in the Anderson Room or email the church office for the Zoom link.

Here's the outline of our sermon series about living in a post-resurrection world:

- April 11: John 20:19-31 "Doubting, Believing, Unifying, Proclaiming!"
- April 18: Luke 24:36b-48 "Got Fish? Let's just have supper"
- May 2: John 15:1-8 "Abide in me: We abide in Christ in order to bear good fruit into the world"
- May 9: John 15:9-17 "True Friendship: The call to sacrificial love is the key to experiencing God"
- May 16: John 17:6-19 "The Ways of the World: We don't belong to the world, but we are in the world to be the incarnation of Christ for all"
- May 23: Acts 2:1-21 "Pentecost: We explore what it looks like to live in spirit-saturated Christian community together"

Christ is Risen! Christ is Risen Indeed! May we believe this bold truth and reflect on the implications that it has for our lives. And may we proclaim this bold truth in word and deed so that all may come to know the joy of what it means to be a resurrection people!







Synopsis: Clashes between white and Indian societies are erupting into war when Sarah Wakefield is taken captive in 1862. She is the wife of an Agency doctor and a known friend of the Sioux. As desperate Sioux warriors attack the Agency, Sarah falls victim to the circumstances. In her narrative of the six weeks she is held captive, she vividly describes her trials, anguish, and pain, both physically and psychologically. Caught between two cultures, she is a woman and a mother struggling with a situation thrown upon her and her family. When she returns to white society, she finds that her battles are not over yet.

Six Weeks in the Sioux Tepees is a reprint of the classic narrative of Sarah Wakefield's survival. Told in her own words, this compelling tale was a best seller when it was originally published more than one hundred years ago.

Standing in the Light:

A Lakota Way of Seeing

by Severt Young Bear & R. D. Theisz

Synopsis: For most of his adult life, Severt Young Bear stood in the light - in the center ring at powwows and other gatherings of Lakota people. As founder and, for many years, lead singer of the Porcupine Singers, a traditional singing and drumming group, he also stood, figuratively, in the light of understanding the cherished Lakota heritage.

Young Bear's own life in Brotherhood Community, Porcupine District of the Pine Ridge Sioux Reservation, is the linchpin of this narrative, which ranges across the landscape of Dakota culture, from the significance of names to the search for modern Lakota identity, from Lakota oral traditions to powwows and giveaways, from child-rearing practices to humor and leadership. "Music is at the center of Lakota life," says Young Bear; he describes in rich detail the origins and varieties of Lakota song and dance.

A descendant of chiefs and of Wounded Knee survivors, he recounts his role in Wounded Knee II 1973 and his association with the AIM Song. A highly respected musician, teacher, and elder, Severt Young Bear performed with the Porcupine Singers throughout North America, taught at Oglala Lakota College, and served on the Oglala Sioux tribal council. He was music and dance consultant for the films Dances with Wolves and Thunder Heart. This book is the fruit of his long friendship and collaboration with R. D. Theisz, a fellow Porcupine Singer and professor of communications and education at Black Hills State University.
