FROM PASTOR GREG

Dear Friends and Family of First Presbyterian Church,

Over the summer, I intend to share some gratitude for our amazing church staff as we begin to emerge from this pandemic. A few weeks ago in worship, I offered some words of thanks for Stephanie Brader, our Director of Christian Education as we were thanking our volunteers. For those of you that missed that Sunday, I wanted to share a summary of what I said here:

The normal job description of a Director of Christian Education is already vast and varied. Steph is an amazing teacher in her own right, and is also a volunteer coordinator for dozens of other teachers of both Sunday school and Wednesday Night Live. She also reviews and selects curriculum, coordinates with me and Damen to align what is happening in Sunday School and what is happening in worship. In addition to all of that, in pre-Covid times, she shops for and facilitates cooking a meal for 50-60 people every week. She's also a surrogate mother for the kids whom she works with.

So this is what our amazing Director of Christian Education does in a normal year, a jack of all trades who keeps our kiddos and volunteers learning about Jesus and loving each other. Since COVID started in March of last year, she has graciously added a ton of additional duties and responsibilities including:

- -Video producer and editor. Every week during COVID, Steph edited and produced videos for our remote Sunday school classes, usually doing two videos per week, one for PreK-2nd graders and one for 3rd-5th graders.
- -Coordinator of volunteer talent who came in and filmed lessons. So, she became a bit of a film director as well, supporting the volunteers who were being filmed for the lessons in addition to her video producing and editing skills.
- -On air talent. When she couldn't find volunteers to come in, she was also in front of the camera, serving as the teacher in many of these weekly videos.

In Hollywood, they would call her a triple threat as a producer and editor, a director, and on-screen talent.

In addition to the video lessons, Steph also became a mailing, shipping, and logistics specialist. Every month or two, with the help of volunteers, she would compile a packet that would be mailed to each household in our church with kiddos. She knows how to do bulk mailings and envelope stuffing parties with the best of them.

She did all of that for the past 14 months with our PreK-5th Graders. Steph also took the lead in confirmation in this COVID time. The 2019-2020 confirmation class was cut short by the pandemic in March of last year. Steph figured out a creative way for them to finish confirmation in the fall and get them confirmed. Then we were faced with how to do confirmation safely for this year, and Steph reworked the entire confirmation process and curriculum for this year, while also teaching the classes and coordinating the confirmation sponsors, confirmands and their families.

As if that wasn't enough, she helped us plan special events like the Palm Sunday parade last year, and she created the route map and put yard signs up for the Pentecost Holy Spirit parade.

I could go on and on and on. I want to acknowledge all that Steph has done this year to keep our Christian Education programs thriving. Steph, I give thanks to God for you each and every day. Thank you for your heart, your commitment to these kids, and the love of God that you are filled with and you share with the kids, the volunteers, and all of us here on staff. Thank you.

More than half of Guatemala's population lives below the poverty level, with nearly a quarter living on less than \$2/day. Many people lack a source of safe drinking water, which has a multiplying impact on poverty. Currently, there are over 210 Living Waters for the World filtration systems installed across Guatemala, providing each of the surrounding communities with an opportunity to live longer, more healthful lives because they are finally free of water-borne illness and disease.

The Guatemala Network of Living Waters for the World helps to support teams that go to Guatemala to install waters systems and provides ongoing support to those systems through local in-country staff. Pastor Greg served on the US board of Living Waters for the World for six years. He currently serves on the Guatemala Board of Living Waters for the World.


