We've heard that wisdom can come from all sorts of places and issue forth from all kinds of lips, but if it is too unfamiliar to us, we have a tendency to turn our backs and cover our ears. We don't let it reach our hearts. We prefer the wisdom that says, "You're right!" and not the stuff that says, "Maybe rethink that one." The wisdom we often choose from the shelf confirms what we already believe we know. We avoid the wisdom that humbles us and calls us to new ways of thinking and being. Your wisdom, O God, calls from the street, it springs forth from unexpected voices and in controversial ways. Forgive us, O God, for the times we have failed to hear your word proclaimed. Help us to recognize your wisdom wherever it may be.




