Dear First Presbyterian Church Family:

Below you will find an update regarding the Christian Education Wing at First Presbyterian Church including the ending of our partnership with the Pooh Corner Day Care and Preschool and how we will be utilizing the space in the near future. I sincerely appreciate the questions we have been getting about both the partnership with Pooh Corner and the building usage because it shows a vested interest in our church and our community. I hope you can take the time to read through this letter. Please know that all the decisions that were made about Pooh Corner and the building were done with much prayer and discernment, always faithfully trying to seek the will of God for the stewardship of the building.

You may remember that one year ago, in August of 2020, Session voted to end our partnership with Pooh Corner after almost 50 years. This was not an easy decision nor one that we took lightly. Pooh Corner was started by some very thoughtful members of our church in the 1970s when there were no licensed day cares in Hastings. From its inception, it was incorporated separately from the church and had an independent board. For the first 20-30 years, the board had many members of FPC on it and there was a great deal of collaboration between the day care and the church. Historically it had been a *ministry partner* of First Presbyterian Church by providing a safe and licensed child care center in the city, *particularly for low income families*. In the last 20 years, Pooh Corner had become more independent, not regularly appointing our church members to serve on their board. FPC continued to support Pooh Corner by providing them space rent free and subsidizing the cost of their utilities.

Following much prayerful discernment, your Session realized that Pooh Corner was no longer a viable ministry partner of First Presbyterian Church of Hastings and made the decision to not renew the contract with them for the use of the space in the Christian Education Wing. Pooh Corner consolidated and expanded their operations at Grace United Methodist Church and moved out of our building on December 31, 2020.

Following that decision, the Mission Committee and Session determined that as a church, we are still deeply committed to providing child care for low income families in our community. To that end, the money that we were using to subsidize Pooh Corner in our space, \$10,000/year, has been designated to support Communities 4 Kids (C4K) - Adams County. This is an organization supported by United Way that is implementing programs that will increase the quality and capacity of child care providers in Adams County, and provide scholarship funds for impoverished area families to be able to afford quality childcare. Our annual gift of \$10,000 to this organization will continue our church's 50 year tradition of supporting child care in our region on a significant scale to ensure that more children and families in Adams County have access to quality child care.

With Pooh Corner no longer in nine rooms of our Christian Education Wing, the Trustees and Session spent some time this winter talking about the best way to utilize the space. Upon the recommendation of our Director of Christian Education, Stephanie Brader, we have moved the rooms we use for Sunday School and Wednesday Night Live back into the second floor of the Christian Education Wing. This will consolidate our PreK-5th grade Christian Education efforts into one place. Currently they are scattered in various rooms around the church, including above the Memorial Room in rooms that are not handicapped accessible. All of the PreK-5th grade Sunday School and Wednesday Night Live classes will be held on the 2nd floor of the Christian Education Wing, including the bells and choir rehearsal. There are also designated bathrooms on that floor for the children to use. This will make our Christian Education ministries more efficient and will also provide for greater safety and security of our children and the volunteer teachers who lead them. Finally, the 2nd floor of the Christian Education Wing is serviced by an elevator, so it is more accessible for people with limited mobility issues including our children and our teachers.

Session and Trustees agreed to this move in June and approved using designated Christian Education funds to update the rooms with new wallpaper and carpet and provide some upgrades to the bathrooms on the second floor. This work is now completed and we are delighted to have a refreshed and consolidated space for our PreK-5<sup>th</sup> grade Christian Education. Along with the classrooms for PreK-5<sup>th</sup> grade, we have also moved our Hand Bell rehearsal room onto the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor, and there is a designated children's choir room and confirmation classroom there as well. If you would like to tour this space, please reach out to me or our Facilities Manager, Tony Calhoun.

Due to this moving and consolidation, there were also three empty classrooms on the first floor of the Christian Education Wing. One of those classrooms will be rented to Hannah Jensen-Heitmann as a music studio space. Hannah has been renting space from the church in the PEACE Center for the last three years. With the open space available in the Christian Education Wing, this provides her a better room for her piano studio. The rent that the church receives from her is used to offset the utility costs in the Christian Education Wing.

The other two rooms on the first floor of the Christian Education Wing will be part of a new ministry partnership of First Presbyterian Church, the *Hastings Community Music Academy*.

The *Hastings Community Music Academy* is a new organization that was vetted by a committee made up of members of Session and Trustees. A few years ago, a consulting firm came to Hastings and identified opportunities to expand access to the arts, particularly to low income families. The hope was that First Presbyterian Church could collaborate with other worthy organizations in the community to provide greater access to the arts, including quality music education and experiences, particularly for students who wouldn't otherwise have those opportunities. I have said that this takes two of our church's greatest strengths: music and mission, and combines them beautifully.

Starting this fall, we will take our first steps into supporting this new worthy organization. Hannah Jensen-Heitmann wrote up a proposal to begin this work that was reviewed and approved by the Worship, Arts, and Music committee, the Trustees, and the Session. The long-term goal will be for the *Hastings Community Music Academy* to be an umbrella organization that facilitates and organizes the vast variety of community music groups and opportunities that our church provides space and support for. This includes ensembles that the church already supports like The Hospice Choir and the Mexican folkloric dance troupe "Raices de mi Pueblo." It also includes creating new ensembles like a community hand bell choir, a community band, and a community choir for adults with special needs. In addition, there will be music classes that are taught like guitar classes, songwriting classes, and master classes with particular instruments. Most of these programs will be tuition based, however scholarships will be offered for students with financial need so that they are accessible to everyone in the community.

Once the *Hastings Community Music Academy* is up and running, it will contribute to the church's budget by paying a monthly fee to help with our facilities and utilities costs. It will also get members of the community into our building and will provide an invaluable community resource and access to the arts. If you have any questions about this new ministry partner, please come talk to me or reach out to Hannah.

Thank you for your continued support of our beloved church, particularly in these strange times. I hope this letter helps to clarify the changes we have made in the last 12 months in our building use and with our ministry partners. I am grateful that we will be able to continue our legacy of supporting childcare for low income families in Hastings in this new way with an annual grant to C4K. I am also really excited for this new chapter in the life of our Christian Education Wing; both our Christian Education moving back into the space that it was originally dedicated for, and the new opportunities that have been presented to us with the *Hastings Community Music Academy*. As always, I am available to talk if you have any questions about any of this, as are your Session members. Please continue to hold all of our church staff and leadership in your prayers.






