Reflections From a Hospice Chaplain - January 30, February 6, & 13

Over the course of three sessions, Pastor Andy Springer will join us to share his reflections as a hospice chaplain with St. Croix Hospice and lead a discussion about the various ways we do or don't handle death well as a culture. Sessions will focus on the historic Christian value of caring for those who are dying and examine contemporary care practices. Andy will lead participants in heartfelt discussions of what it means to be mortal and during the final session members of the Caring Voices Choir (colloquially known as the Hospice Choir) will join in to share what they do and offer reflections on their own experiences as well.

More than 12 percent of Hastings residents live below the federal poverty line.

Because poverty does not discriminate, you likely know someone in your own neighborhood, workplace, or church who is struggling to make ends meet.

Often the largest bills each month are for rent and utilities. Getting help with a daunting bill payment even just once can turn the tide and help an individual or family reach financial stability again.

No one should have to choose between heating their home during the frigid winter months and putting food on the table, and yet, sadly, many are forced to make that very choice. The Salvation Army has utility assistance programs such as Share the Warmth, as well as, food programs to help meet these needs.



You are invited to participate in a very exciting program offered by the First Presbyterian Church, Hastings. Several years ago, through the generosity of the late Luella Langenberg, a program was established to encourage the youth of our church in their musical pursuits.

Parents of students in grades 1-12 may apply for up to \$250 per semester to offset the cost of private music instruction. Applicable areas of study include: piano, voice, guitar, or any band/orchestral instrument, Grants are limited to one per child. Parents must be members of First Presbyterian Church and students must be active participants in the church choir/music program.

Application forms will be available in the church office and on the church website starting January 12, 2022. DEADLINE FOR THE SPRING GRANT PROGRAM IS FEBRUARY 1, 2022. ALTHOUGH GRANTS ARE RENEWABLE, PARENTS MUST RE-APPLY EACH SEMESTER.
