Dear First Presbyterian Church Family:

Our youth did an outstanding job leading worship on Sunday. Their reflection on the story in Luke chapter 5 of Jesus telling Simon Peter to put his boat out in deep water and cast his nets, and their call to "trust the boat" was both a faithful proclamation of the gospel, and a good challenge for all of us to learn to trust God in our daily lives. I want to reflect a little more on the story with you this week. I invite you to put yourself into the shoes, or sandals, of the fishermen we read about in Luke 5. They've been out all night fishing, and haven't caught a thing. This is not fishing for fun or recreation, this is their livelihood. So they come back to shore pretty disappointed. Maybe they've had a few days where the fishing hasn't been great. Now they are starting to get worried, wondering how they are going to feed their families with no fish to eat or sell.

They pull their boats up to shore, look around, and see this large crowd following this man. The man walks up to them and has the audacity to climb in one of their boats and asks them to push the boat out a little way from the shore. This man, Jesus, sits in the boat and starts teaching this crowd that showed up. You start listening to what he is saying as he teaches the crowd and you realize there is probably something special about him. He gets done teaching, looks at you, and says, "Now put your boat out in the deep water, and let down your nets for a catch." Your initial reaction is hesitation. "We have worked all night long but have caught nothing." But then you start thinking about what he was teaching about, how you started to realize that there was something special about this guy, so you follow up with, "If you say so, I will let down the nets."

Of course, we know the rest of this story. You catch so many fish that it fills two boats to overflowing. And then Jesus says to you: "From now on you will be catching people."

Can you think of times in your life when God was prompting you to do something difficult? Has there been a time in your life where you had to take a risk, to put your boat out into the deep water? Deep water is scary, both literally and metaphorically. When have you felt God prompting you to do something that is scary?

Friends, this story is here in the bible to teach us. I'm not aware of anyone in our congregation who makes a living as a commercial fisherman, and yet we encounter this story and know that it has significance for us today.

I hope that you can see the call for all of Jesus' followers in this passage to trust God. And to take risks on behalf of our faith, to put out our boats in the deep water and to cast our nets, even when we are tired, or frustrated. I hope that this story reminds us of our dependence on God, our call to trust God, and our call to cast our nets, so that through our life, our example, and our service, we too can become fishers of people.

Have a blessed week, and don't be afraid to put your boat out in deep water, cast your nets, and become fishers of people.

About World Day of Prayer

Since the nineteenth century, Christian women in the United States and Canada have initiated cooperative activities in many areas of concern for women and children, recognizing the critical role of prayer in mission work and their call to promote

world peace through worldwide mission work. The first organized "day of prayer for the world" was held in Canada on January 9, 1920. the United States soon followed on February 20, 1920.


Now, hundreds of thousands of women (and men, youth, and children) from around the world and in every region gather to collectively worship on the first Friday in March. Each year, a different country serves as the writer of the World Day of Prayer worship service and other materials. Women of that country's national WDP committee interpret scripture within their cultural context and prepare a worship service; women around the world lead the services.

World Day of Prayer is supported by sacrificial and benevolent mission offerings given by individuals through these annual services. Each of the 170 countries celebrating World Day of Prayer has an ecumenical committee of women representing many cultures, races, and faith traditions. Each country's committee is responsible for determining the use of the offering as it relates to the theme for each year. Offering grants are made to women and children's groups in each country.

World Day of Prayer USA promotes justice and equality for women through prayer, partnerships, service and celebration. For more information, visit www.wdp-usa.org.

Thank you very much for the grant money awarded to the Hastings Evening Lions Club. This gift has allowed us to continue our service to the Hastings area.

The last couple months we have completed vision and hearing screenings at 18 schools using the Mobile Screening Unit supplied by the Nebraska Lions Foundation. So far this year we have screened 1939 children and found 122 with abnormal vision and 139 with abnormal hearing reports. These children were referred to local professionals for additional diagnosis and correction. Financial assistance for this is provided for those families in need for these services. Hastings Evening Lions volunteered approximately 400 hours for these projects.

Additional vision screenings were performed for preschools and adults by club members without Nebraska Lions Foundation assistance. These screenings will continue throughout the year.

Financial assistance for eye exams, therapy, glasses and other requests thus far this fiscal year have totaled over \$2500 with \$1970 being spent in December, 2021 and January, 2022 alone. Your gift has taken up the slack replacing funds lost by COVID eliminating 2 fundraisers in the past 2 years.


