Dear First Presbyterian Church Family:

Exactly two years ago, on March 17, 2020, I wrote a letter to the congregation sharing that Session, the leadership council of the church, held an emergency meeting to discuss this new virus called COVID-19. At that meeting, Session voted to follow the recommendation of the South Heartland District Health Department and the guidelines of the Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services to suspend in-person worship, along with most of the other activities in our building.

A lot has happened in the last two years. We continued to follow the guidance of the South Heartland District Health Department and went for 11 months with no in-person worship in our building. Instead, we had our broadcast ministry and held car parades, outdoor worship services in the park, parking lot hymn sings, and a drive-in Christmas Eve service. We also did remote Sunday School for children and youth with videos and packets, along with adult education classes and bible studies.

In February of 2021, we restarted in-person worship with an RSVP system, social distancing, masks, no singing, and other precautions. When the cases dropped to single digits last summer, we removed our mask mandate for six weeks. When cases started to rise again in August of 2021 due to the Delta surge, we put our mask mandate back in place, again following the advice of our local health department. Session consistently tied our masking policy to the metrics published by the health department, voting that we would end the mask mandate when the spread of COVID-19 dropped into the "moderate" range and stayed there for two weeks. We continued to monitor those metrics every week.

Two weeks ago, the metrics published by the South Heartland District Health Department finally dropped into the "moderate" risk range. On March 15, the health department also acknowledged this writing, "... The district had maintained an overall 'moderate to substantial' community transmission of SARS-CoV-2 for 14 days in a row." As a result, the health department has discontinued the COVID-19 Health Advisory this week. You can read about that here: https://bit.ly/SHDHD3-15

Session met last night, March 17, 2022, two years to the day from our first emergency meeting, and voted to follow the guidance of the health department and remove the mask mandate for all of the facilities at First Presbyterian Church of Hastings, effective immediately. This means that masks are now optional for all activities in our building, including Sunday morning worship. We will also be removing the social distancing ropes in the sanctuary.

Much thought and prayer went into this decision. Not only did we look at the metrics and follow the data, we also looked at vaccination rates as well as the widespread availability of KN95 masks, which provide protection to the person wearing the mask. Masks will continue to remain an option for anyone who chooses to wear them, and will still be available at all the entrances to the church. The church will also provide KN95 masks for anyone who needs one, just call or stop by the church office.

Our masking policy was always based on a desire to care for the most vulnerable in our community, particularly those who are not yet eligible for the vaccine and those who are immunocompromised. That stems from our faith in Jesus Christ who calls us love one another with a self-sacrificial love. We sacrificed our own comfort and wore masks to support the health and safety of others in our church family and our community. Now the local conditions make it safer to lift the mandate with less than 2 cases recorded per day last week in our community.

For the last two years, Session has faithfully prayed and discerned each time we have met. I have been so grateful to have a group of 13 leaders making these decisions together. It has not been easy and we are keenly aware of the challenges that our COVID-19 precautions have caused for some of our members. We are deeply grateful for your patience and grace as we have worked our way through these challenges, sometimes meeting multiple times each month. If you see a member of Session who has served anytime over the past two years that we have been navigating this pandemic, please thank them for their service, and say a prayer of thanksgiving to God for them.

We hope and pray that we will be able to continue our return to normal, and we ask that you join us in this prayer. Session will also remain vigilant and continue to monitor the local conditions of COVID-19 spread and respond as necessary. At this point in the pandemic, the best way to protect ourselves and those around us is to please stay home if you are experiencing any symptoms.

As always, should you have any questions, please feel free to reach to me or any member of Session. Thank you again for your patience and grace over these last two years. I look forward to seeing some of your smiling faces on Sunday!

Ann L Binfield Scholarship

The criteria for the Ann L Binfield Scholarship require a recipient:

- 1. to be an outstanding student,
- 2. to have financial need*
- 3. to be a member of First Presbyterian Church, Hastings NE
- to attend a Presbyterian college or university.

Amount of the scholarship will vary, depending on the number of applicants. The scholarship will be paid directly to the recipient's college for the 2022-2023 school year.

- 4. College transcript (for renewing application)

*If your family submits FAFSA information to the college that you plan to attend, we will receive a financial need analysis from that institution. However, if your family does not submit a FAFSA, you should explain your financial need in your Binfield Scholarship application.

Chip Essex Memorial Scholarship

The criteria for the Chip Essex Memorial Scholarship require a recipient:

- 1. to be a member of First Presbyterian Church, Hastings NE
- 2. to attend a 2 year or 4 year, post-secondary education

One scholarship will be awarded for \$500 and it can be renewed one time only. The scholarship will be paid directly to the recipient's college for the 2022-202 school year. Preference will be given to students that are not currently receiving an Ann L Binfield Scholarship.
