

Dear First Presbyterian Church Family:



Even now, nearly a quarter into the 21st century, we remain connected to our nineteenth century brethren who envisioned a college in south central Nebraska, where education and perseverance could make a positive impact on the world. As the Hastings College Alma Mater chines: "Dear Friends, again we sing, in voices loud and strong": let us lift our voices in celebrating the accomplishments of these graduates, and send them forward with our prayers to continually make this a better world whether in their own neighborhood and community, or more globally reaching beyond borders and politics.

# Living Waters for World



Feel free to bring a friend and snack money if you'd like to purchase coffee/soda/snacks!


#### Sr. High-


