LIGHTING OF THE ADVENT WREATH AND CHRIST CANDLE Klug/Kluver Family Today we celebrate Christmas Eve and the birth of the Christ Child! We light all of the candles on the advent wreath. During this season of Advent, we lit the candles of love, joy, peace, and hope.

Tonight, we light the center candle which represents Jesus Christ. When we light this candle, we remember Jesus' birth. Our waiting has ended!

When we look at the center candle, we remember that God sent Jesus to give hope, peace, joy, and love to all people. The angel Gabriel appeared to Mary and told her to not be afraid for she would bear the Christ child. We are people of hope and not of fear.

Outside of Bethlehem the shepherds saw a great light and heard the voices of angels telling them to not be afraid for they would meet the Christ child. They traveled to the manger, saw the baby Jesus and found peace.





Thank you for coming to worship with us on Christmas Eve at First Presbyterian Church of Hastings! Whether you worship here every week, a few times a year, or this is your very first time visiting us, we are *glad that you are here* and we hope that you find a *warm welcome* as we come together to celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ!

In 2023, First Presbyterian Church of Hastings will celebrate its 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary! We have many exciting events that we are scheduling throughout the year including special music offerings, a food truck roundup event and a car show in our parking lot, a living history night event, bagpipes, a bluegrass worship service, a jazz worship service, and so much more. We hope you will join us in the coming year as we celebrate 150 years of sharing the love of Christ from the heart of Hastings.

Our church is actively engaged in *local ministry and mission* including the United Harvest Mobile Food Pantry, Open Table, and support of many local organizations including Habitat for Humanity, enCourage Advocacy Center, Revive Ministries, Crossroads Rescue Mission, and more. Every summer we offer Vacation Bible Schools for the whole community. All of these activities and ministries provide volunteer opportunities for you to share the love of Christ and see where God is at work in Hastings!

We also participate in *national and global mission* through mission trips every year. These trips provide more opportunities for you to share the love of Christ and learn where God is at work around the world!

We invite you to join us on Sunday mornings at 8:30 for a contemplative worship experience in our chapel. Or join us at 10:30 for a traditional worship experience in our sanctuary with our glorious Chancel Choir and organ music. At both services you will find engaging, bible-based preaching.

Our church seeks to engage our **hearts** and our **minds**, so we also offer amazing *learning opportunities*. Come to Sunday School for all ages (including adults) at 9:15am to hear engaging speakers and dig into the Bible to learn about what it means to you. During the week, bring your kids to our "Wednesday Night Live" program for 3-12-year-olds from 5-6:45pm for bible study, rec time, music, and dinner. We also have an active youth group for 6th-12th graders from 5-7pm every Sunday night. In addition, we offer adult bible and book studies on Tuesdays and Wednesdays at noon.

Do you like to make *music*? Come join our Chancel Choir, play in the handbell choir, or bring your kids to our children and youth choirs or handbell groups.

At First Presbyterian Church of Hastings, we are a *community of hope* where you will always hear a message of hope proclaimed.
