Dear First Presbyterian Church Family:

We observed Ash Wednesday last week with a moving service of music, prayer, and the imposition of ashes. Thank you to all who came and participated in the service, with special thanks to our Chancel Choir, our Chancel Handbell Choir, and our organist Linda Vollweiler, whose musical contributions added so much depth and meaning to the service.

The observance of Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the Season of Lent, the six weeks leading up to Holy Week and Easter. It mirrors the 40 days that Christ spent in the wilderness, facing temptation and trial. We are invited to spend these weeks in reflection and repentance, recognizing our need for Christ and his the saving work that he accomplished. As we journey with Christ to the cross during this season, we are called to redirect our thoughts and energy into our faith, and think about what we believe and how we embody our beliefs in the world.

At First Presbyterian Church of Hastings, we will be spending the next six weeks doing that by focusing on the creeds and confessions that help us understand and live out our faith. You are all invited to dig into these important statements and affirmations of faith, and we will be providing multiple opportunities each week to do that.

Every Sunday, your pastors will be preaching sermons based on one of the creeds or confessions. Our scholar in residence, Dr. Dan Deffenbaugh, will also teach an adult education forum each week on the same topics. Following worship we will share a devotion each week that allows our members to reflect on the creed or confession throughout the week with accompanying scriptures and prayers. We will distribute paper copies of the devotion on Sunday as you are leaving worship and will also email them out on Mondays, along with a link to the Adult Education Forum.



Syria-Turkey Earthquake



Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA) urges your support in the aftermath of the 7.8- magnitude earthquake and its aftershocks in Syria and Turkey. Thousands are reported dead and injured, numbers that will rise as search and rescue continues. Buildings have been reduced to rubble, and roads and bridges have been severely damaged, resulting in dangerous conditions for first responders. In some places, such as Aleppo, this destruction is compounding the damage of the now 11-year war in Syria.

PDA is providing emergency relief and short-term recovery in the impacted areas. PDA will remain active throughout the recovery process, accompanying our partners as they determine long-term program needs and providing financial support for building and resilience.

Years of recovery lie ahead, and your commitment will help PDA extend the hands of Christ. Will you stand in the "GAP" for the people affected by this catastrophic earthquake?



PW NATIVE AMERICAN BOOK STUDY

Join us virtually as we grow through our book discussions to learn more about racial injustices and increase our understanding of Native American/Indigenous Peoples' traditions, customs, and historical trauma. We hope this leads to becoming better equipped to build relationships.

February 6 (1:30 PM or 6:30 PM sessions) and February 20 (1:30 PM session) The Dull Knifes of Pine Ridge: A Lakota Odyssey by Joe Starita

Synopsis: Joe Starita tells the triumphant and moving story of a Lakota-Northern Cheyenne family. In 1878, the renowned Chief Dull Knife, who fought alongside Crazy Horse, escaped from forced relocation in Indian Territory and led followers on a desperate six-hundred-mile freedom flight back to their homeland. His son, George Dull Knife survived the Wounded Knee Massacre and later toured in Buffalo Bill Cody's Wild West Show. Guy Dull Knife Sr.

fought in World War I and took part in the Siege of Wounded Knee in 1973. Guy Dull Knife Jr. fought in Vietnam and is now an accomplished artist.

February 20 (6:30 PM) - Session with author Joe Starita

The author, Joe Starita, of *"The Dull Knifes of Pine Ridge: A Lakota Odyssey"* shares with us the research completed and conversations held in writing this book, what drew him to tell the history of this family, and how it has impacted his life. Time to discuss elements of the book and ask questions will be provided. It's always an informative session with the author!

February 27 (1:30 PM or 6:30 PM) viewing documentary, "On a Knife Edge"

The documentary, "On a Knife Edge" that was released in 2017, takes us into the fifth generation of the Dull Knife family. The film is 89 minutes in length and we would have a 30-minute discussion following the viewing and a break.

SUMMARY: "Set against a background of rising tension and protest, a Lakota teenager, George Dull Knife, learns first-hand what it means to lead a new generation and enter adulthood in a world where the odds are stacked against him. Filmed over a five-year

period, and culminating with the events at Standing Rock, *On a Knife Edge*, provides a privileged view into the world of George Dull Knife as he becomes politically active with the American Indian Movement, confronts the challenges of growing up on the Pine Ridge Reservation, and wrestles with accepting leadership of his storied family from his father, Guy Dull Knife Jr."


