Rev. Bill Nottage-Tacey - I remember a baptismal Sunday in the 1950s:

My very first memories of First Presbyterian Church came on a "Baptismal Sunday" in the late 1950's when I was attending worship with a friend from Osmond whose Aunt and Uncle lived here in Hastings and attended First Presbyterian Church. I noted in the bulletin that the Sacrament of Baptism was to be observed and I had thoughts of the parents, child, and grandparents surrounding the font and Dr. Kessler baptizing a child. I was not prepared for the two doors in the front paneling opening and a "stream" of parents and babies pouring into the front of the sanctuary creating a semi-circle around Dr. Kessler and Dr. Sweetland.

After declaring the opening baptismal statements from the Book of Common worship and the parents answering the baptismal questions in the affirmative, one by one the two pastors alternated baptizing the children and concluding with the entire congregation of 700+people standing and in unison, promising to receive these children into the membership of Christ's Holy Church and to nurture them toward confirming the faith for themselves. That was followed by the thundering hymn "Rejoice Ye Pure in Heart" which included the line "Yes, on through life's long path, Still chanting as ye go; From youth to age, by night and day, In gladness and in woe. Rejoice, rejoice, rejoice give thanks and sing," and it echoed through my body and soul.

It was awesome for a boy of nine whose little church back home consisted of 75 people on a good

Sunday! Who would have thought then, that that nine year old from Osmond would one day have the honor of pastoring some of those Boomer Babies as Elders, Deacons, and friends? God indeed works in mysterious ways!


