#### Wonderful memories of the Saints who preceded us!

When I recall some of my special memories of First Presbyterian Church, I remember many opportunities making music and after doing so, considering the significant impact of that music in worship. Many of those memories relate to specific anthems sung by the Chancel Choir; or to special holiday (Christmas and Lenten) cantatas with instrumentalists, soloists, narrators, and congregational participation; and believe it or not, funeral and memorial services.

Over the years, I have been honored to provide special music for memorial and funeral services of church members (including many personal and family friends and choir members.) Often, when I hear a certain hymn or a solo, I recall the memorial service(s) where that hymn was sung. Many times, a fond memory of the deceased fills my mind; or I recall the place in the choir loft (or in the Sanctuary) the departed sat. Sometimes, I can envision the facial expression I would receive when seated in the choir loft from the person after the choir's anthem or the joy I witnessed as they shared singing congregational hymns. Needless to say, I feel very fortunate to have this "mental scrapbook" of these wonderful people!

Many people may consider this remembrance unusual and somewhat morbid. My intent is anything but that! The power of music in providing comfort to a grieving family and in my case, to our church members is especially profound. Whether it be the Malotte "Lord's Prayer," or "Amazing Grace", or "Lead On, O King Eternal", or "When the Saints Go Marching In", or "Be Thou My Vision" or "Come, Come, Ye Saints", or "What a Wonderful World", music has fulfilled its purpose and was integral to worshipful celebrations and remembrances. Melody, harmony, poetry, singing, composing, and performing are God-given gifts. Being called to use those talents with meaning and spirituality in service to the Creator's kingdom is also a gift from God...I have been blessed.






