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CALL TO CONFESSION

PRAYER OF CONFESSION

Holy God, you have called us to serve others as Christ has served us. We confess that we have not followed Christ’s example as fully or as often as we should. We turn away from people in need. True humility eludes us, and we hide our own vulnerability before others. You have commanded us to love one another as you have loved us. We confess that we do not love so generously. Gathered on this Holy Thursday, we confess that we are capable of denying and betraying you and one another, no less than the first disciples. Forgive us, merciful God, and cleanse us of all our sin; then guide our feet to walk with you always. In Christ’s name we pray. Amen.

INVITATION TO THE LORD’S TABLE

GREAT THANKSGIVING

The Lord be with you.

BREAKING OF THE BREAD

COMMUNION OF THE PEOPLE

FOOT and HAND WASHING

If you come forward for the foot washing, leave your shoes and socks behind, walk forward, and line up at the basin to your right in front of the cross. The person in front of you will take a seat at the basin. Extend one foot and then the other over the basin while the person who is washing pours water over your feet. The one who is washing will dry your feet with a fresh towel. Hold and help support the person's foot over the basin of water. Pour the water slowly and prayerfully over one foot, then the other; dry the person's feet gently. You may wish to say: "How beautiful are the feet of those who bring good news" (Romans 10).

If you come forward for the hand washing, line up at the basin to your left in front of the piano. The person in front of you will hold their hands over the basin and you will pour water over their hands and then take a fresh towel and dry their hands. You may wish to say: "May God prosper the work of your hands for kindness" (Psalm 90).

MUSICAL ACCOMPANIMENT FOR HAND AND FOOT WASHING

THE PRAYERS OF THE PEOPLE

Loving, listening God, ever attentive to the voices of those in need, we call on your name so that we might live. Now hear our prayer:

For the church that bears Christ's name, that the world may know we are his disciples by the love that we have for one another. Lord, in your mercy,

Hear our prayer.

For leaders of nations and all persons in positions of authority, that their lives may be marked by Christ-like service and love. Lord, in your mercy,

Hear our prayer.

For all who are oppressed and living in captivity, that they may escape from evil and death to find the land of freedom you have promised. Lord, in your mercy,

Hear our prayer.

For those who are hungry and thirsty this day and for those who have too much, that we may learn to share your generous gifts, O God. Lord, in your mercy,

Hear our prayer.

For those who are dealing with illness, loss or facing death, that the presence of Christ may bless and keep them. Lord, in your mercy,

Hear our prayer.

At this time I invite you to speak your prayers aloud. As each person finishes I will say "Lord, in your mercy," and we will all respond: Hear our prayer.

Answer us in the day of trouble, O God, so that we may lift up the cup of salvation in the presence of your people, giving thanks for all your goodness to us; through Jesus Christ our Savior. Amen.

STRIPPING OF THE CHURCH

While the final hymn is sung, communion elements, linens, banners, and other symbols are removed from the sanctuary. The congregation is invited to think of Jesus, who on the night of his betrayal laid aside his woven tunic and tied a towel around his waist. He stripped for service. The Gospel tells us that later "they stripped him" for mockery and death. The act of stripping the church reflects the last few days of Jesus' life. It also stands for those from whom something or someone is being taken away. It stands for us and our journey with Christ on this Holy Week.

All are invited to depart in silence.
