Pentecost and the work of the Holy Spirit!

Dear First Presbyterian Church Family:

This Sunday we will celebrate Pentecost Sunday, like we do every year 7 weeks after Easter. While Pentecost may be less popular than Christmas or Easter in the church in the United States, in many parts of the world the celebration of Pentecost Sunday is just as big as Christmas or Easter in terms of the attendance, the celebration and the joy that accompanies it. That is because Pentecost is considered the "birthday" of the Christian church. Jesus was resurrected and has ascended into heaven, and Pentecost marks the arrival of the Holy Spirit giving birth to the church. So this is a joyful and spirited celebration in the Christian tradition.

We have tried to capture some of that celebratory spirit over the last seven years by doing a "Pentecost in the Park" service along with other churches in Hastings, and we will do that again this year. We hope you can join us on Sunday, May 28 at 10:30am in Chautauqua Park to celebrate Pentecost Sunday alongside our sisters and brothers from two other churches in Hastings. We will have some special Bluegrass-style music this year as part of the worship service, along with upbeat hymns, joyful prayers, and a dialogue sermon between four fun pastors! The Holy Spirit will be moving among us and it promises to be a delightful time to worship God alongside our friends from First United Methodist and the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ.) And if that wasn't enough, the Baristas coffee truck will be there to help keep us caffeinated and full of energy!

All this talk of the Holy Spirit arriving and giving birth to the church raises some interesting questions about how we Presbyterians talk about the Holy Spirit. My experience is that Presbyterians can pretty easily grasp the idea of God the Creator, and of Jesus Christ, but the Holy Spirit tends to be a little tricky for us. I know that was the case for me during many years of my faith journey. Then I discovered one of our creeds called "The Brief Statement of Faith." If this sounds familiar, that is because we studied and preached on the creeds and confessions during the Season of Lent, including "The Brief Statement of Faith." It has a section on the work of the Holy Spirit that really resonates with me and gives me language to talk about how I see and understand the Holy Spirit at work in the world, in the church, in our faith, and in my life. Below you will find that section. I invite you to read through it and think about your own understanding of the Holy Spirit as we prepare to celebrate Pentecost! Have a blessed and spirit-filled week!



Living Waters for the World (LWW) **trains volunteers** to establish and lead water mission teams that partner with communities to **implement and operate** sustainable water purification systems and health education programs.

<u>LWW Networks</u> come alongside water teams and partners throughout every phase of a water project. They provide essential support for **sustainable** water systems that produce **clean water for a generation**.

Volunteers are the heart and soul of Living Waters for the World. Unlike organizations that rely on paid staff to initiate and execute water projects, Living Waters for the World relies on volunteer teams trained by volunteer instructors working within volunteer-led networks. LWW's small staff of 3 full-time and 3 part-time employees exists to facilitate the activity and long-term impact of this volunteer force.

Over 2,000 individuals have trained at <u>Clean Water U</u>, and they have engaged an estimated 10,000+ volunteers as members of LWW water teams. Volunteers have also guided the establishment of international networks, the development of Clean Water U's curriculum, and much more!

Volunteers have made LWW what it is today and will play an integral role in ensuring clean water for generation in the communities LWW serves.
