That time between Easter and the Ascension...

Dear First Presbyterian Church Family:

Exactly one month ago today we celebrated the glorious resurrection of Jesus on Easter Sunday. It was an incredible celebration of hope! More than 530 people heard the Good News proclaimed on Easter Sunday at First Presbyterian Church between our two services and our broadcast ministries. Once again, I want to thank everyone that worked hard to make our Easter worship services special. On Easter morning, we read the account of the empty tomb from the Gospel of John. Mary Magdalene encountered the risen Christ, but she did not recognize him until he said her name. And then we read:

Jesus said to her, "Do not hold on to me, because I have not yet ascended to the Father. But go to my brothers and say to them, 'I am ascending to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God.'" Mary Magdalene went and announced to the disciples, "I have seen the Lord"; and she told them that he had said these things to her. (John 20:17-18)

After this encounter, the resurrected Christ spends 40 days walking the earth before ascending into heaven. During those 40 days, he continues to teach his disciples through a series of "post-resurrection appearances." One of those is the story of Christ appearing to doubting Thomas, which we studied in worship the week after Easter. Another one of those post-resurrection appearances is the story of Christ appearing to two disciples on the road to Emmaus, which we studied in worship two weeks ago. If you missed that, you can watch it here, the sermon starts at the 31:45 mark: <https://fb.watch/kq1c1VwjBq/>

While we have been studying and preaching about these post-resurrection appearances in worship, we have also held an adult education forum series led by our scholar in residence, Dr. Dan Deffenbaugh. He spent 3 weeks leading an in-depth study of this time between Christ's resurrection and Christ's ascension. You can watch those at this link: <https://bit.ly/post-resurrection>

In addition to worship and our adult education forums, most weeks Pastor Damen and I record a short podcast that provides some insight into the scripture as well. We call those the Monday Check-In, which you can access here: <https://bit.ly/FPCMonday>

Throughout the year, we strive to provide opportunities for our church family to engage in deep study of scripture. Pastor Damen, Dr. Deffenbaugh, and I work together to align what we are presenting in the adult ed forums with what we are reading and preaching about in church. Our children's ministry does the same thing, the children are studying and learning about the same scriptures and stories on Wednesday night and Sunday morning that we preach and teach about in worship. Our hope in doing this is to help increase our knowledge and understanding of scripture and the story of God at work in the world, and to see where we fit into that story.

We hope that you have enjoyed studying these post-resurrection appearances of Jesus with us, and you have taken the opportunity to reflect on those 40 days between Easter and the celebration of Christ's ascension into heaven. Have a great week!

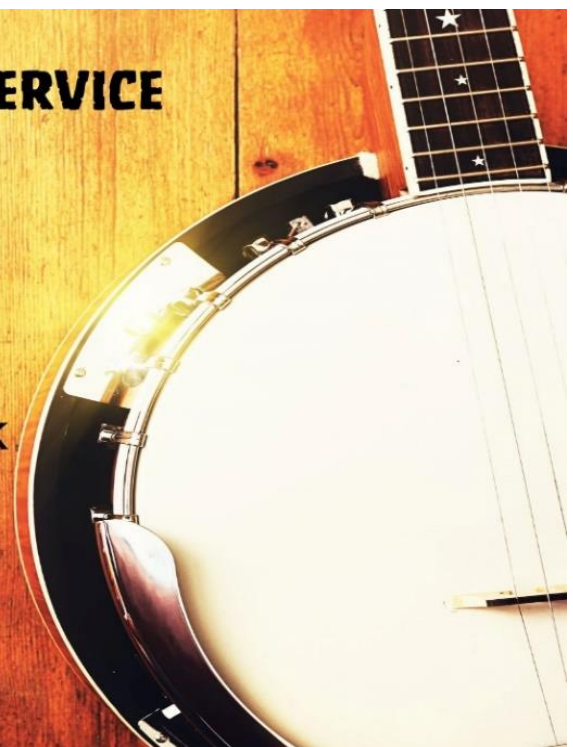

For those of you that are new to our church or community, the Open Table Sack Lunch Program is a community wide program providing free daily sack lunches Monday through Friday that are distributed from the Catholic Social Services Office in downtown Hastings.
