Dear First Presbyterian Church Family:

The last two weeks have brought some glorious music to our church and the larger community!

On Sunday, May 28, we celebrated Pentecost in the Park. The choir sang some beautiful Bluegrass/Appalachian style songs and we worshiped with our sisters and brothers from two other churches! On Sunday, June 4, in honor of the 300th anniversary of Johann Sebastian Bach writing cantatas for worship, we shared *Gelobet sei der Herr, mein Gott, BWV 129*, a Bach Cantata with a 20 voice choir and soloists, a chamber orchestra, and our organ. So on Saturday, June 3, we held a "Bach and Bluegrass Concert" in the sanctuary. The concert started with 30 minutes of Bach music followed by an encore performance of the Bluegrass/Appalachian music that the choir sang on Pentecost Sunday. We had a great turnout to that event with more than 150 church and community members present!

We are so excited to offer these musical opportunities to our church family and the larger community as part of our 150th Anniversary. We will continue *Living a Legacy of Love* through these special events. Speaking of legacies, these musical events were made possible through the generosity of the late Luella Langenberg. In 2001, through her bequest, Mrs. Langenberg established a fund to support the special music ministries of First Presbyterian Church of Hastings. We are grateful for Luella Langenberg's enduring legacy.

I also want to share gratitude for some of the great folks who made this happen. I am grateful to our new Chancel Choir Director Brett Epperson for dreaming up these ideas and getting them started. I am also grateful to our Organist and Music Director Linda Vollweiler for her great work leading, rehearsing, accompanying, and supporting these musical endeavors. Thanks to church member Louie Eckhardt for getting the chamber orchestra together. Thank you to the musicians, to our staff for getting things set up, and to all of you for supporting this!

The choir that sang for both of these events was pulled together by Brett Epperson. It is a semi-professional musical group called the *Spiro Spero Singers*, based on the Latin phrase *Dum spiro spero* which means: While I breathe, I hope. It is made up of a cross-section of our community including local music teachers, stay-at-home moms, computer programmers, and others. Our hope is to continue to support the development of this group for special musical events like these.

We are blessed with so much musical talent in our community, as well as strong support for the arts. Thank you for being a part of this church and for your faithful support of our worship, arts, and music ministries! Through these ministries, we are *Living a Legacy of Love* as we celebrate our 150th anniversary and prepare for the next 150 years and beyond!


United Harvest Mobile Food Pantry is a joint ministry with First Presbyterian Church & First United Methodist Church. We provide a food distribution to 400+families.

June 18. You may donate in honor of a father or in memory of a father. Proceeds will go to Living Waters for the World.

Living Waters for the World (LWW) **trains volunteers** to establish and lead water mission teams that partner with communities to **implement and operate** sustainable water purification systems and health education programs.

<u>LWW Networks</u> come alongside water teams and partners throughout every phase of a water project. They provide essential support for **sustainable** water systems that produce **clean water for a generation**.

Volunteers are the heart and soul of Living Waters for the World. Unlike organizations that rely on paid staff to initiate and execute water projects, Living Waters for the World relies on volunteer teams trained by volunteer instructors working within volunteer-led networks. LWW's small staff of 3 full-time and 3 part-time employees exists to facilitate the activity and long-term impact of this volunteer force.

Over 2,000 individuals have trained at <u>Clean Water U</u>, and they have engaged an estimated 10,000+ volunteers as members of LWW water teams. Volunteers have also guided the establishment of international networks, the development of Clean Water U's curriculum, and much more!

Volunteers have made LWW what it is today and will play an integral role in ensuring clean water for generation in the communities LWW serves.

June Communion Offering: Raices de mi Pueblo

Raíces de mi Pueblo (Stories of our town) is a folkloric dance group that meets for practices twice a week in our Peace Center. It is also our monthly communion offering for the month of June. Maria started this dance class five years ago in response to her concerns about her own children and other children in her neighborhood becoming disconnected from their roots and not participating in safe, fun, physical activities after school hours. She decided she could do something about this by offering free dance classes that would be open to anyone. Currently her class has grown to approximately 20 dancers ranging in age from three to seventeen. In addition to practices these dancers have performed at many events, festivals and venues in Hastings and throughout the state. Due to Maria's goals, they have grown in cultural knowledge, communication skills, confidence, pride and dance skills. There is a connection to the larger community that has evolved from these performances. Maria makes a point of teaching dances from different regions of Mexico and Central America. The costumes are a part of the culture and story of the dances.

Since Maria does not charge students for the dance classes, she depends on donations to buy costumes, or to buy the material to make the elaborate and beautiful costumes for a constantly growing and changing group of dancers.
