Dear First Presbyterian Church Family:



Their names and photos are in the newsletter this week, so if you see them around, please welcome them. In the last 6 ½ years that I have been your pastor, we have added **145 new members**! This is really remarkable and is another indicator of the health and vitality of our church. Thank you for all that you do to make our church a warm and welcoming place.

Another mark of a healthy and vital church, as well as a mark of faithful discipleship, is financial support of the church. As author Randy Alcorn writes, "Stewardship isn't a subcategory of the Christian life. **Stewardship is the Christian life**. After all, what is stewardship except that God has entrusted to us life, time, talents, money, possessions, family, and grace?"

Last week we mailed out a letter and pledge cards for both our Annual Stewardship Campaign and the Capital Campaign. We hope that you and your family will prayerfully consider your financial support of the church. **Please return the pledge cards on or before Sunday, November 5.**

The Annual Stewardship Campaign funds our church budget. Your ongoing financial gift to the church supports our **people and our programs.** The theme for the annual stewardship campaign this year is "Growing our Legacy." We have spent 2023 celebrating the 150th Anniversary of our church and our legacy of love. In 2024 we hope to continue to grow that legacy, just as we are growing in church membership and active participation in the life of the church. **Our annual budget will increase** 5% this year primarily due to an increase in the cost of medical insurance, as well as my desire to give a modest cost of living increase to our amazing staff who are doing an outstanding job. **We ask that you consider increasing your pledge to the church's annual budget so that we can cover these increasing costs.**





Our Capital Campaign theme is "Living a Legacy of Love." We are hoping to raise \$2million to remodel and renovate our church building and the PEACE Center so that we can continue to provide hospitality and hope for our church members and our community long into the future. **This is a once-in-a-generation opportunity to support our church's legacy of love.** Gifts to the capital campaign are over and above your pledge to the annual stewardship campaign. They can be given as one-time gifts or spread out over the next two or three years.



CROP Walk




The weather for this year's CROP Walk was perfect, and the walkers were all energetic and enthusiastic. A big Thank You to all of you, who shared by giving, or walking.




