On Sunday, 10/1, we celebrated **Hastings College Sunday**. We were joined by The Hastings College Choir led by Dr. Brett Epperson and were blessed with incredible choral music. We also had a dialogue sermon between Dr. Jessica Meeske and I about her journey from growing up in a small Presbyterian Church, to Hastings College, to Dental School, to her job as a pediatric dentist and the work she does to ensure all children have access to medical and dental services, particularly the poor and marginalized. 
