

#### Keeping track of the health and vitality of our church

Dear First Presbyterian Church Family:

As we close the books on 2023, I want to share some exciting numbers with you that point to the health and vitality of our church. I don't spend a lot of time talking about numbers, because ministry is ultimately about people and our journey as disciples of Jesus Christ. However, it is often said, "what we actually count truly counts," so it is important to reflect on how we are doing as a church, and statistics are one way that we can track that. Here are two important statistics for our congregation:

Our average worship attendance in 2023, including in-person and on-line, was 288 people per Sunday. That is an increase from 270 people per Sunday in 2022 and 262 people per Sunday in 2021. This shows approximately 5% growth year over year. Attendance is one trackable metric to reflect on how a church is doing. This is in contrast to national trends, as you can see in this graph from the Hartford Institute for Religious Research:

\$630,000 in 2021. This amounts to almost 5% growth in giving year over year for the last three years. We are blessed with an incredibly generous congregation, THANK YOU!

Those are two tangible metrics that we can track, and it is important to pay attention to attendance and contributions as ways to measure how we are doing as a church. However, as a counterpoint to my earlier quote, Einstein said, "Not everything that counts can be counted." So, let's look at some intangible metrics that we can use to reflect on the health and vitality of our church:

There is a spirit of compassion in our church that is seen through people caring for one another and our community, volunteering their time, and seeking to be the hands and feet of Christ. There is a sense of authentic fellowship and joy as we gather together for worship, or Wednesday night activities, or potlucks, or other events; I know our congregational life committee has a full schedule because people want to come together as a family of faith. People are volunteering to serve on boards and committees to help our church thrive and be a source of love and light in the lives of our members and in our community. I could go on and on thinking about all of the intangible ways that we can see our church thriving.

Thank you for all that you do to make First Presbyterian Church of Hastings a community of hope, where we always proclaim a message of hope. The source of our hope is Jesus Christ, and so I pray as we begin 2024, we can continue to grow in our discipleship as individuals and as a congregation, that we can grow closer together as a family of faith, and that our numbers continue to grow as a church so that we can share the love and light of Christ with our community and the world!
