### Beginning our journey in the Season of Lent

Dear First Presbyterian Church Family:

In an article about the Season of Lent on *Patheos*, author Deborah Arca wrote: "Once considered the liturgical purview of Catholics, Lent – the 40-day period from Ash Wednesday to Holy Thursday before Easter – has become more and more embraced as a liturgical season with legs within the Protestant churches. With the comfort level of spiritual practices on the rise in mainstream congregations for the past several decades, Christians now regularly claim Lent as a season for deep reflection, prayer, repentance, and overall spiritual growth. So, the question is: How will you walk through Lent this year?"

As a family of faith, we will begin our Lenten journey on Wednesday, February 14 at 7pm with an Ash Wednesday service in the sanctuary. We offered a preview of the Season of Lent, as well as a lesson in how we get the ashes for our Ash Wednesday service in a video we showed during worship on Sunday 2/11 that you can rewatch here: <u>https://youtu.be/WNZj-B2bhp0</u>

Following our Ash Wednesday service, we will focus on the Season of Lent during our Sunday morning worship services for the next six weeks, starting on Sunday 2/18 when our children will "bury the alleluias" as we enter this season of contemplation, repentance, and transformation.

Each week, we will publish a Lenten devotional guide for the week that includes a daily scripture and prayer. We will include those in the weekly worship bulletin and also publish them on our website and Facebook page. You can find those at this link: <u>https://fpchastings.org/devotions/</u>

We have been studying the Gospel of Mark this winter, and it is a great way for us to enter this Season of Lent as we reflect on what it means to follow Jesus. Rev. Fred Plummer says, "It is no mystery why the early followers of Jesus often referred to themselves as people of the way. The Greek word for way is *hodos* which is often translated into English as path or road. The writer of Mark, the first written of the four biblical Gospels, is devoted to explaining what this path was all about. For Mark, it is first and foremost about the importance of discipleship... It is a way that is driven by love rather than fear, even the fear of death. Like so many of the great spiritual teachers throughout history, Jesus understood we are motivated primarily by two energies. One is love and the other is fear. Nothing saps our ability to love and to be loved more than fear. In fact, love and fear are diametrically opposed energies. One who is motivated by love cannot be hampered by fear. For most people this is a different way of living."

Oftentimes people choose to give up something for Lent like chocolate, coffee, or social media. I would encourage our family of faith to give up fear, and to take up love during Lent.

Jesus invites us onto this path of love so that we can discover a new perspective and a new experience of life. He teaches us that there is no fear in love, for perfect love casts out fear. (1John 4:18) So during this season, we are invited to journey with Jesus to Jerusalem without fear. If we want to experience the promised new life, we must be willing to take this journey. It will require some deep soul searching and hopefully a willingness to empty ourselves of those things, those thoughts, those emotions we hold onto out of insecurity, our hurts, or our losses. Only when we empty ourselves of fear and negativity can we be filled with love and joy. This is never easy. For many of us, it is a lifetime journey. The Season of Lent offers us a chance to recommit to this way of living. Join us on our Lenten journey this year as we travel with Jesus to Jerusalem and commit ourselves to giving up fear and taking up love.

Daily Lenten Scriptures and Prayers Feb 15-17

### **THURSDAY, FEB 15, MARK 9:30-35**

"They went on from there and passed through Galilee. He did not want anyone to know it; for he was teaching his disciples,



saying to them, "The Son of Man is to be betrayed into human hands, and they will kill him, and three days after being killed, he will rise again." But they did not understand what he was saying and were afraid to ask him.

Then they came to Capernaum; and when he was in the house he asked them, "What were you arguing about on the way?" But they were silent, for on the way they had argued with one another who was the greatest. He sat down, called the twelve, and said to them, "Whoever wants to be first must be last of all and servant of all."

### PRAYER

At the outset of lent, give me a humble heart, a heart that is willing to admit to my shortcomings and mistakes. A heart longing to grow and change. A heart that seeks to serve others before myself. For these forty days, help me to put aside the part of myself that calls for attention, acknowledgement, and prestige. Help me, O God, to be inspired by Jesus and learn once again what it means to love you and my neighbor. Amen.

# **REPENT & BELIEVE**

### FRIDAY, FEB 16, MARK 9: 42-50

"If any of you put a stumbling block before one of these little ones who believe in me, it would be better for you if a great millstone were hung around your neck and you were thrown into the sea. If your hand causes you to stumble, cut it off; it is better for you to enter life maimed than to have two hands and to go to hell, to the unquenchable fire. And if your foot causes you to stumble, cut it off; it is better for you to enter life lame than to have two feet and to be thrown into hell. And if your eye causes you to stumble, tear it out; it is better for you to enter the kingdom of God with one eye than to have two eyes and to be thrown into hell, where their worm never dies, and the fire is never quenched.

"For everyone will be salted with fire. Salt is good; but if salt has lost its saltiness, how can you season it? Have salt in yourselves, and be at peace with one another."

### PRAYER

I think, O God, that I understand the point Jesus is trying to make, even if it does frighten me a little. I should be willing to remove the parts of myself and of my life that keep me from following your ways. Perhaps during lent, I will discover what those parts may be, but I will need courage, nurture, and wisdom to actually remove them from my habits and routines. I confess, O God, that I sometimes avoid the harsh words, the words that ask me to prune and remove. Help me, gracious Lord, to see the blossom that can emerge from such things. Amen.

### **SATURDAY, FEB 17, MARK 10:13-16**

People were bringing little children to him in order that he might touch them; and the disciples spoke sternly to them. But when Jesus saw this, he was indignant and said to them, "Let the little children come to me; do not stop them; for it is to such as these that the kingdom of God belongs. Truly I tell you, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God as a little child will never enter it." And he took them up in his arms, laid his hands on them, and blessed them.

### PRAYER

If the last shall be first, then it makes sense that your kingdom belongs to children. Children have little power, control, or influence over the world. They really are at the mercy of others. They live, learn, and grow by the generosity of those around them. You, O God, ask me to see the world differently. You insist that your kingdom operates by different norms: the last are first, the vulnerable are a treasure. Help me, O God, to see the world the way that you do. Amen.
