1st SCRIPTURE

Selections of Psalm 51

MEDITATION

2nd SCRIPTURE

Psalm 103:6-14 (CEB)

The Lord works righteousness; does justice for all who are oppressed.

God made his ways known to Moses; made his deeds known to the Israelites.

The Lord is compassionate and merciful, very patient, and full of faithful love.

God won't always play the judge; he won't be angry forever.

He doesn't deal with us according to our sin or repay us according to our wrongdoing, because as high as heaven is above the earth, that's how large God's faithful love is for those who honor him.

As far as east is from west—that's how far God has removed our sin from us. Like a parent feels compassion for their children— that's how the Lord feels compassion for those who honor him.

Because God knows how we're made, God remembers we're just dust.

PRAYERS OF INTERCESSION

We pray for an end to hunger and homelessness, knowing we are called to share our bread and to open our doors. We pray for an end to false righteousness, evil speech, and shallow piety in our lives, in the church, in our national life, and among all the nations.

Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer.

Forever God, we pray that your kingdom will come in fullness; that what is perishable will be raised imperishable, and that death itself will be swallowed up in victory; Lord in your mercy, **hear our prayers. Amen.**
