Join us on our Holy Week journey!

Dear First Presbyterian Church Family:

During the announcements at worship on Palm Sunday, I said that Holy Week is like our March Madness and Super Bowl weekend all rolled into one. I don't use sports analogies very often, but this one is pretty accurate. In the liturgical year, the events and worship services during Holy Week represent both the foundation and pinnacle of our faith.

An Episcopal priest from Florida, Rev. Tim Schenck, wrote this:

When you hear clergy strongly encouraging you to attend the services of Holy Week, especially the Great Three Days (Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, the Easter Vigil), it's not just because they like to see more people in the pews, or it's good for their egos, or they want parishioners to see how much effort goes into these liturgies.

It's because they believe in the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ and the transforming power of the Christian faith. It's because they love you and want nothing more than for you to have such a moving encounter with our Lord, that it will change your life. It's an invitation rooted in profound love, and a recognition that there is literally nothing more important in the entire world than to participate fully as we collectively journey from the Upper Room to Calvary to the Empty Tomb.

With that introduction, I want to personally invite you to our Holy Week services. Below I briefly describe why we hold these services and what happens at them:

Maundy Thursday 3/28: In the gospel of John, Jesus says, "I give you a new commandment, that you love one another like I have loved you." The Latin word for commandment is "maundy," so we have the chance to embody the commandment of Jesus to love one another. At this service we will remember the night that Jesus was betrayed and arrested, and participate in communion and an optional footwashing ritual as a tangible sign of love for others. This service is at 7pm in the sanctuary and includes our choir.

Good Friday 3/29: Despite the terrible crucifixion of Christ that we remember at this service, this day has been called Good Friday because it leads to the resurrection of Jesus and his victory over death and sin and the celebration of Easter. We will have a candlelit service where we extinguish the candles while we read the story of Jesus trial and death. This is a contemplative service with simple music that is at 7pm in the sanctuary.

Prayer Vigil 3/29-3/31: We hold a prayer vigil from the conclusion of our Good Friday Service until Easter Morning, commemorating the time that Jesus lay in the tomb. In prayer we come before God to acknowledge that we are the body of Christ, to pray for ourselves, our community, and our world, and to ask for God's guidance and presence. You are invited to sign up for one hour time slots to come into the Chapel to pray or to participate from home. There will be prayer stations set up in the Chapel to use during the Vigil including prayers collected from our church members during our prayer calling on Monday of Holy Week. The Vigil is open to anyone in our family of faith who is willing to commit one hour to intentional prayer during the weekend of Easter. Easter Sunday: Join us on Easter morning at 8:30am or 10:30am for a joyful celebration of the resurrection of Christ! Our Easter services include special music from our Choir, Bell Choir, Organist, and the Cathedral Brass. The special music is used to triumphantly proclaim our hope as resurrection people! At this service we will read the story of the empty tomb and we will reflect on the word "Hallelujah" and the image of the butterfly as a symbol of our new life in the risen Christ. Please join us and we encourage you to invite your family, neighbors, and friends.

I hope and pray that Holy Week is a meaningful time of contemplation, reflection, and worship for all of you as we prepare our hearts and minds to celebrate the glorious resurrection of Jesus on easter morning!
