Reflecting on Servant Leadership

Dear First Presbyterian Church Family:

I serve on the Hastings College Board of Trustees. I am often invited to open our Board of Trustees meetings with a brief reflection and prayer. We had a meeting this week, and I decided to offer a reflection on "servant leadership." While I wrote this reflection and prayer for the Board Meeting, I think it is relevant for all of us. Each of us has the opportunity to be a leader in some capacity whether that is in our family, our work, as a volunteer, in the community, or in the church. I hope these words can provide us all insight on our call to serve as Christ. Below is the reflection that I shared at the meeting followed by a prayer:

In January, February, and March, our church did a deep dive into the gospel of Mark. A pattern emerged as we read the stories of Jesus' ministry. Jesus taught that true greatness comes from serving others first. In Mark 9, Jesus said, 'Whoever wants to be first must be last of all and servant of all.' And then in Mark 10, Jesus doubles down saying, '...Whoever wishes to become great among you must be your servant, and whoever wishes to be first among you must be slave of all. For the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve...'

Over and over again, Jesus reminded his disciples that true greatness comes in service to others. He modeled that servant leadership throughout his earthly ministry, caring for others, teaching through his words and his deeds, and even washing the feet of his disciples. These days, many self-professed leaders can get caught in the trap of serving only themselves; they use power for their own benefit. But Jesus went against the grain, he emphasized that leaders should focus first on meeting the needs of their people and empowering others. That is a somewhat counter-cultural model of leadership, but one I think we are all familiar with.

True leadership requires setting an example. You do this by living out the behavior you wish to see in others. Following Jesus' example, the early Christian leaders, like the apostle Paul, showed the way in their faith and conduct. Today's leaders, whether religious or secular, can only earn credibility when they model integrity and values, and seek to serve others. You won't get others to do something simply by telling them to do it. You need to demonstrate it.

In this way, you'll be walking the talk instead of just repeating empty phrases. Paul did that beautifully for the church in Philippi. He helped plant the church and modeled servant leadership for them while he was there with them. Then he left and a few years later he wrote a letter back to the church, from a prison cell. Let's read a short section of that letter from Philippians 2 and then share a prayer. Listen for how Paul is modeling servant leadership in these words:

Philippians 2:1-4

Therefore, if there is any encouragement in Christ, any comfort in love, any sharing in the Spirit, any sympathy, complete my joy by thinking the same way, having the same love, being united, and agreeing with each other. Don't do anything for selfish purposes, but with humility think of others as better than yourselves. Instead of each person watching out for their own good, watch out for what is better for others.

Let us pray.

Gracious and loving God:

Grant us the wisdom to lead with vision and the humility to embody servant leadership in all our endeavors. In the spirit of service, we reflect upon the timeless words of Jesus and Paul which implore us to be grounded in joy, love, and unity. May we emulate the selflessness and humility demonstrated in these verses as we navigate the path ahead.

May we be ever mindful of those who have come before us. We are standing on the shoulders of giants and we are stewarding the resources of many generations of generous and faithful supporters. Guide our hearts and minds to serve with unwavering dedication, recognizing that true leadership is found in the willingness to serve others. May our actions be a testament to the transformative power of servant leadership, inspiring others to follow in the footsteps of humility and grace.

May your guiding light illuminate our path, empowering us to fulfill our collective mission with integrity, compassion, and unwavering dedication. In your holy and loving name, we pray. Amen.
