Reflecting on the Trinity...

Dear First Presbyterian Church Family:

On Sunday, May 26, we celebrated “Trinity Sunday” at First Presbyterian Church. On Trinity Sunday we proclaim the mystery of our faith in the triune God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit, One-in-Three and Three-in-One. The celebration of Trinity Sunday began among Western Christians in the 10th century and developed slowly until it was formally established on the Sunday after Pentecost by Pope John XXII (1316-1334).

The Holy Trinity is a core doctrine of the Christian Faith, the triune God is the basis of all we are and do as Christians. In the name of this triune God, we are baptized, which was why we read the Great Commission in Matthew 28 where Jesus tells us to baptize, “In the name of the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit.” As the baptized ones we bear the name and image of the triune God in our very being; we are of the family of the triune God. We affirm this whenever we recite the creeds and say what we believe. Our discipleship is rooted in the mighty acts of our triune God who created us, saved us, and is still active in redeeming the world. The Trinity holds a central place in our faith, and yet it can also be very confusing.

Our Director of Christian Education, Rose Koepp, and I recorded a podcast where we reflected on the doctrine of the Trinity. You can watch that podcast on YouTube by clicking on this link: <https://youtu.be/KXCvVQW14Fc> During the podcast, we talked about how God is infinite, and our human language is finite, so anything we say about God and the Trinity will never be complete. Every attempt that we make to describe the Trinity will eventually fall short because we don't have the language to fully explain a divine mystery, but that doesn't mean we shouldn't talk about and reflect on these things.

Rose used the concept of H₂O in her message to the children on Sunday, and the three states of water: solid, liquid, and gas. Each state of water can help us when we need it for different things. If we have an injury, ice can numb the pain and reduce the swelling. If we are thirsty, we take a drink of liquid water. If we are cold, we can use steam in radiators to warm our house or use steam to make hot coffee. Ice is not water or steam; water is not steam or ice; steam is not ice or water, but they are all H₂O. This is a great way to begin to think about the Trinity, at its core it is here to help us. A member of our church who has been a Sunday School teacher for many years, Jill Kramer, went home after worship and took this a step further, ascribing different states of H₂O to different aspects of each person of the Trinity as a way to explain this to children. Water – God – Creator: What does water come from? God, who gathered the waters and created the seas.

Ice – Jesus – Son: Ice is solid and can be touched, felt, and seen. Jesus, as the incarnation of God was fully human and walked the earth. He could be touched, felt, and seen.

Steam – Holy Spirit: Steam requires heat. On the day of Pentecost, tongues of fire hovered over the disciples and they were filled with the Holy Spirit in Acts 2.



I love the creativity that Jill came up with to think about the Holy Trinity. It provides a unique way to try to explain a theoretical theological concept to concrete thinkers. We are so blessed to have staff and volunteers that help us learn and grow in our faith journey.

As I mentioned in my sermon, the key takeaway from the mystery of the Holy Trinity is that God models Christian community for us in God's very nature, and God desires for us to live in Christian community. In the context of that community, we can love and be loved by God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, and we can learn to love each other well. So even if you can't explain or fully comprehend the Trinity, know that you are designed to live in a loving community. And I am grateful for the community that is our First Presbyterian Church family of faith.

Presbyterian Women Father's Day Offering

Presbyterian Women will be collecting a Father's Day Offering. We will be set up in the Memorial Room on Sundays, June 9, and June 16 to take donations. You may donate in honor of a father or in memory of a father. Proceeds will go to Living Waters for the World.

Living Waters for the World (LWW) **trains volunteers** to establish and lead water mission teams that partner with communities to **implement and operate** sustainable water purification systems and health education programs.

[LWW Networks](#) come alongside water teams and partners throughout every phase of a water project. They provide essential support for **sustainable** water systems that produce **clean water for a generation**.

Volunteers are the heart and soul of Living Waters for the World. Unlike organizations that rely on paid staff to initiate and execute water projects, Living Waters for the World relies on volunteer teams trained by volunteer instructors working within volunteer-led networks. LWW's small staff of 3 full-time and 3 part-time employees exists to facilitate the activity and long-term impact of this volunteer force.

Over 2,000 individuals have trained at [Clean Water U](#), and they have engaged an estimated 10,000+ volunteers as members of LWW water teams. Volunteers have also guided the establishment of international networks, the development of Clean Water U's curriculum, and much more!

Volunteers have made LWW what it is today and will play an integral role in ensuring clean water for generation in the communities LWW serves.

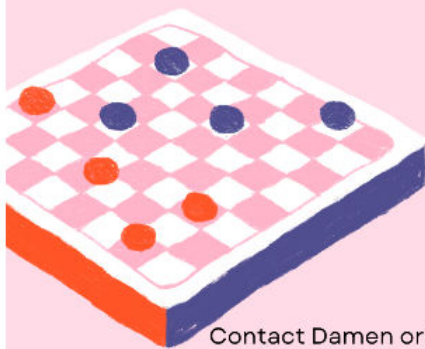
