Building the beloved community in an age of polarization: The power of table fellowship:

Dear First Presbyterian Church Family:

In this season of our community and our nation, it can feel like we're more divided than ever. But as Christians, we are called to something deeper—building a community grounded in love, hope, and humility. This fall, our sermon series and adult education classes at First Presbyterian Church, “Building the Beloved Community in an Age of Polarization,” invites us to explore how the stories of the Bible and our faith in Jesus Christ can guide us in that call.

On September 15, we reflected on Genesis 15 and Ephesians 2, focusing on the story of Abram. The sermon was entitled: “Fear not, abound in hope!” and it reminded us that we are called to break down the dividing walls of hostility and be people of hope and not fear. On September 22, Pastor Damen preached on the story of Joseph in Genesis 37 and 50 and got us thinking about humility and forgiveness with a sermon entitled “Group Think.” These sermons highlighted two key pillars of community life: hope that bridges divides and the humility required to forgive and reconcile. A central part of fostering this beloved community is what we call “table fellowship”—gathering together, breaking bread, and sharing life. Throughout Jesus’ ministry, we see time and again the significance of the table. He dined with tax collectors, sinners, and disciples alike, reminding us that the table is a place where we can meet others just as they are, even those with whom we disagree. Jesus modeled for us that sharing a meal can be a powerful act of grace and reconciliation.

down for a meal can break down barriers, even among people who might have fundamental disagreements. Around the table, we can lay aside our differences and see one another through the eyes of love.

At First Presbyterian, we are creating opportunities for this kind of table fellowship. Whether through our adult education classes, the trivia night at Steeple Brewery on Sunday, September 29th, the Blessing of the Pets service on October 2nd, or the churchwide potluck on October 13th, we believe in the power of gathering together. Presbyterian Women's groups also continue to build connections through shared meals and meaningful conversations, reminding us that no matter our differences, we are all part of the same body of Christ. I encourage you to join us for these opportunities to share table fellowship.

As we journey through this sermon series together, may we take up the call to be builders of the beloved community, sitting down at tables with open hearts, ready to listen, share, and break bread together in love.

Exciting News: New restrooms off the sanctuary now open!

We are pleased to announce that the new restrooms off the sanctuary are now open for use. These are *family restrooms*, meaning they are single-seat restrooms with locking doors that can be used by anyone, just like the bathrooms in our houses. This design is the industry standard for new restrooms, for example you will see all of the public restrooms at the College View Retirement Community are this way.

These family restrooms provide added flexibility and convenience, especially for those assisting loved ones with dementia, mobility issues, or for parents helping young children. We hope these new facilities will enhance the sense of welcome at our church for our members and the community.

By September 8, the former women's restroom off the sanctuary will be converted into a "Wiggle Room" for families with small children that will also include one additional single seat family restroom with a locking door and a changing table.

We will also be updating the restrooms behind the fellowship hall with new flooring, tile, and fixtures. Those will continue to be a *Men's Room* and a *Women's Room*.

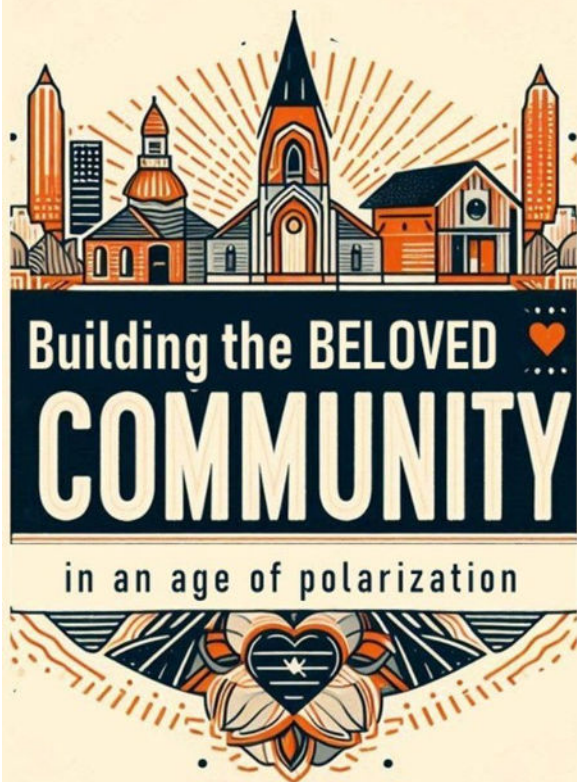
