Building the beloved community together

Dear First Presbyterian Church Family:

This summer, as I was planning out my sermon themes for the year, I felt a nudge of the Holy Spirit to seek to address some of the polarization we are facing as a community and a nation. I put together a sermon series entitled "Building the Beloved Community in an age of polarization." For seven weeks, we will be reflecting on these themes in our preaching, our worship, and in small groups, which we hope you will consider joining. During this season, I want to provide some additional reflections on these themes in my newsletter articles as well. As we journey through life, one of the most profound truths of our faith is found in the opening pages of the Bible. Genesis 1:26-31 reminds us that we are created in the image of God — the *imago Dei*. But what does this mean for us today, especially in an age where division and polarization often define our interactions?

This foundational belief shapes our relationships with God, one another, and the world. Being made in God's image is not merely about physical likeness or intelligence but about embodying the very nature of God. And at the heart of God's nature is love, as 1 John 4:8 tells us, "God is love."

To bear God's image is to reflect God's love in everything we do. We are called to love sacrificially, selflessly, and without conditions. This kind of love is radical, especially in today's polarized world. Yet, it is our calling as followers of Christ.

Recognizing the image of God in others transforms our relationships. Whether we're looking at a friend, a stranger, or someone whose views differ from ours, we are called to see them as bearers of God's image. Imagine how our communities would change if we all interacted with one another through this lens — recognizing the divine in everyone. Even in the midst of disagreement, God's image remains.

We recognize that the image of God is love, and we are called to be a reflection of that love in the world. But is not merely enough for us to reflect love, we have to put that love

in action. Two weeks ago, we studied the epistle of James where we were challenged to be "doers of the word, and not merely hearers." Our faith must be expressed in action, particularly through love. Love is central to our identity as Christians, and as Jesus commanded in John 13:34-35, "Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."

Throughout history, Christians have stood out because of their love in action. From the early church caring for the sick during plagues to believers today serving their communities, it is this love that sets us apart. We are reminded that our faith is not just about words, but about living out God's love in real, tangible ways.

As we navigate a world of divisions, we are called to build a beloved community, a term popularized by Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. It is a vision of a world where all people are cared for, free from poverty, hate, and division. Here at First Presbyterian Church of Hastings, we believe that by embracing our identity as image-bearers of God and living out Christ's love, we can be part of this transformative work.

Let us move forward together through the coming months, bearing the image of God and embodying God's love in our actions, words, and relationships.

Exciting News: New restrooms off the sanctuary now open!

We are pleased to announce that the new restrooms off the sanctuary are now open for use. These are *family restrooms*, meaning they are single-seat restrooms with locking doors that can be used by anyone, just like the bathrooms in our houses. This design is the industry standard for new restrooms, for example you will see all of the public restrooms at the College View Retirement Community are this way.


These family restrooms provide added flexibility and convenience, especially for those assisting loved ones with dementia, mobility issues, or for parents helping young children. We hope these new facilities will enhance the sense of welcome at our church for our members and the community.

By September 8, the former women's restroom off the sanctuary will be converted into a "Wiggle Room" for families with small



children that will also include one additional single seat family restroom with a locking door and a changing table.

We will also be updating the restrooms behind the fellowship hall with new flooring, tile, and fixtures. Those will continue to be a *Men's Room* and a *Women's Room*.


