Looking For Questions

Many have noticed but I'll just say it plain. When given a chance, I like to leave a lot of silence in a worship service. Almost immediately after I started helping to lead worship services here at First Presbyterian Church people noticed that the time for silent confession had grown almost exponentially. And there are a few reasons as to why I like a good time of silence so much. The first is that I find there is a lot of noise in the world having a few moments of silence can be quite peaceful and refreshing for all of us. The second is a bit more personal. During a worship service I spend a lot of time talking and it is important for me to be encouraged to listen as well. But the most critical reason is this: it is important to sit with the question.

Sitting with a question; turning it over, wrestling with it, and exploring all of its intricacies and implications leads to a depth that we cannot and do not find when we rush to answers or quickly retreat to talking points and known perspectives. Taking the time to sit (or stand or walk or talk) and ponder is an increasingly scarce skill but it is a skill that, when used well, often uncovers hidden depths of knowledge and insight about our God, ourselves, and the world around us.


Over the past month and a half, as a congregation, we have sat with one fundamental question; how are people of faith called to engage with the political realm? And this question has led other equally important and equally interesting questions: What does it mean to recognize that *everyone* is created in the image of God? What if they aren't acting like it? What if *I'm* not acting like? Whose voice do I hear most often? Can I admit that I may be wrong? Have I created any idols lately? To what do I give my ultimate allegiance? None of these questions are simple. None of these questions lead to easy answers and it has been a pleasure to witness as people of faith have sat with them in all earnestness and honesty over the course of the last six weeks.

I understand that many people approach faith and Sunday mornings with an eye towards discovering answers. Though, to be honest, I suspect that we may be better served to approach faith with an eye towards discovering questions. The better our questions and the longer that we sit with them the more we may be able to sink down into our faith and into our God. I wonder, what question is God calling you to discover?


