

Presbyterian Women Hurricane Helene Relief Drive

Presbyterian Women will be in the Memorial Room on Sundays following worship, doing a drive to help with disaster relief from Hurricane Helene. The following items are being requested. Monetary donations will also be accepted to purchase the items to assemble the kits.

Cleanup Kits

- scrub clean. Do not use a bucket that has held chemicals of any kind. No screw lid. Advertisement on the outside acceptable.) One five-gallon bucket with resealable lid (If reused, please
- One 4-8oz. pump spray air freshener
- Five scouring pads (No stainless steel or pads with soap in them. Remove from packaging.)
- Seven sponges, including one large
- One scrub brush (With or without handle.)
- 18 reusable, lightweight multipurpose dry cleaning towels (No terrycloth, microfiber or paper towels. Remove from packaging.)
- One 32-64oz. or two 25oz. bottle(s) of liquid laundry detergent
 - One 16-34oz. bottle of liquid disinfectant dish soap
- One 12-40oz. bottle of liquid concentrate household cleaner that can be mixed with water (No spray bottles.)
- One package of 36-50 clothespins
- One 50-100ft. clothesline (Cotton or plastic line.)
- Five dust masks (N95 particulate respirator dust masks preferred; No surgical masks.)
- Two pairs of heavy-duty, waterproof dishwashing gloves (Latexfree, non-surgical. Durable for multiple-use. Remove from packaging.)
- One pair of work gloves (Cotton with leather palm or all leather.)
- 20-28 heavy duty or contractor type 30-45 gallon trash bags on a roll (Remove from packaging.)
- One 6-9oz. bottle of non-aerosol insect repellent (Pump spay bottles must have protective covers. Packs of 10-20 insect repellent wipes also acceptable.)

Value: \$75

All cleaning items must be new, and all liquid items must be capped Please do not enclise cash or checks inside of the kits or the boxes. making sure they are packaged securely to avoid damaged during and securely tightened. Please place all items into the bucket, shipment. Snap the lid on tight and seal with packaging tape.

Hygiene Kits

- approximately 15" x 28" to 16" x 32" (no fingertip, bath, dish One hand towel measuring towel or micro-fiber)
 - One washcloth
- removed from the package One wide-tooth comb
- Must be sturdy with at least 6 inches of teeth
- No pocket combs or picks
- Rattail and combs without handles are acceptable
- clipper removed from the One fingernail or toenail package (either one is acceptable)
- One bath-size bar of soap in the original package
- One toothbrush in the original package
- Ten standard size Band-Aids
 - Wide-tooth Comb

All items need to fit inside a onegallon Ziploc type bag. Remove the excess air from the bag and seal before boxing.
