We also participate in *national and global mission* through mission trips every year. These trips provide more opportunities for you to share the love of Christ and learn where God is at work around the world!

We invite you to join us on Sunday mornings at 8:30 for a contemplative worship experience in our chapel with communion every week. Or join us at 10:30 for a traditional worship experience in our sanctuary with our glorious Chancel Choir, handbell choirs, youth and children's choirs, and organ music. At both services you will find engaging, bible-based preaching.

Our church seeks to engage our **hearts** and our **minds**, so we also offer amazing *learning opportunities*. Come to Sunday School for all ages (including adults) at 9:15am to hear engaging speakers and dig into the Bible to learn about what it means to you.

During the week, bring your kids to our "Wednesday Night Live" program for 3-12year olds from 5-7pm for dinner, bible study, and music. We also have an active youth group for 6th-12th graders from 5-7:15pm every Wednesday night. In addition, we offer adult bible and book studies on Tuesdays and Wednesdays at noon.

Do you like to make *music*? Come join our Chancel Choir, play in the handbell choir, or bring your kids to our children and youth choirs or handbell groups.

At First Presbyterian Church of Hastings, we are a *community of hope* where you will always hear a message of hope proclaimed.
